3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Children Protection
- 5 from Video Game Violence and Sexual Content Act".

1 SEC. 2. FEDERAL TRADE COMMISSION STUDY.

2 The Federal Trade Commission shall evaluate and re-3 view the system employed by the Entertainment Software Ratings Board to assign ratings to video games. The Com-4 5 mission shall transmit to Congress, not later than 180 days after the date of enactment of this Act, a report on 6 7 the Commission's findings, including the opinion of the 8 Commission as to whether the ratings system results in 9 the exposure to children of excessive violence and sexual 10 content.

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11 SEC. 3. GOVERNMENT ACCOUNTABILITY OFFICE STUDY.

12 The Comptroller General shall conduct a study on the 13 impact of video games on the mental stability and growth 14 of children and young adults. The Comptroller General 15 shall transmit to the Congress, not later than 180 days 16 after the date of enactment of this Act, a report on the 17 findings of the study.

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
