## A BILL

- To authorize the Military Spouse Legacy Association, Inc., to establish a commemorative work on Federal land in the District of Columbia and its environs to honor all those who have put their country first as military spouses throughout our Nation's history.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Military Spouses Me-
  - 5 morial Act of 2007".
  - 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
  - 7 Congress finds the following:

- 1 (1) From the earliest days of our Nation to the 2 present day, the military spouse has been the back-3 bone of the military family.
  - (2) Our military members have answered our Nation's call to duty due to the strong support and selflessness of the military spouse.
  - (3) The military spouse is the unsung hero who has traditionally placed spouse, family, and country above any personal needs or ambitions.
  - (4) The strength, sense of purpose, and courage shown by the military spouse in maintaining the cohesion of their family during both war and peacetime has been instrumental in the retention and morale of our Nation's military.
  - (5) Our military widows have shared in their spouses' last full measure of devotion and deserve the recognition, respect, and thanks of a grateful Nation.
  - (6) President Ronald Reagan, in honoring the legacy of the military spouse, proclaimed the Friday before Mother's Day to be Military Spouse Day.
  - (7) It is appropriate to extend this recognition into a permanent national monument to commemorate the instrumental contribution, service, and sacrifice of every military spouse.

- 1 (8) Every married service member recognizes 2 the contributions and dedication of their military 3 spouse and the time has come for the Nation as a 4 whole to honor all military spouses for their service 5 to our country.
- 6 (9) This monument will recognize all spouses
  7 from the revolutionary war to the present day war
  8 on terror and all conflicts that come in the future
  9 and will be a universal symbol of the military spouse
  10 and the strength and courage to maintain a family
  11 and support our service members during war and
  12 peacetime.
- 13 SEC. 3. COMMEMORATIVE WORK TO HONOR MILITARY
- 14 SPOUSES.
- 15 (a) Authority to Establish Commemorative
- 16 Work.—The Military Spouse Legacy Association, Inc.,
- 17 may establish a commemorative work on Federal land in
- 18 the District of Columbia and its environs to honor all
- 19 those who have put their country first as military spouses
- 20 throughout our Nation's history.
- 21 (b) Compliance With Standards for Commemo-
- 22 RATIVE WORKS.—The commemorative work authorized by
- 23 subsection (a) shall be established in accordance with
- 24 chapter 89 of title 40, United States Code (commonly
- 25 known as the "Commemorative Works Act").

- 1 (c) Use of Federal Funds Prohibited.—Federal
- 2 funds may not be used to pay any expense of the establish-
- 3 ment of the commemorative work authorized by subsection
- 4 (a). The Military Spouse Legacy Association, Inc., shall
- 5 be solely responsible for acceptance of contributions for,
- 6 and payment of the expenses of, the establishment of that
- 7 commemorative work.
- 8 (d) Deposit of Excess Funds.—If, upon payment
- 9 of all expenses of the establishment of the commemorative
- 10 work authorized by subsection (a) (including the mainte-
- 11 nance and preservation amount provided for in section
- 12 8906(b), of title 40, United States Code), or upon expira-
- 13 tion of the authority for the commemorative work under
- 14 chapter 89 of title 40, United States Code, there remains
- 15 a balance of funds received for the establishment of that
- 16 commemorative work, the Military Spouse Legacy Asso-
- 17 ciation, Inc., shall transmit the amount of the balance to
- 18 the Secretary of the Treasury for deposit in the account
- 19 provided for in section 8906(b)(1) of such title.
- 20 (e) Definitions.—For the purposes of this section,
- 21 the terms "commemorative work" and "the District of Co-
- 22 lumbia and its environs" have the meanings given to such
- 23 terms in section 8902(a) of title 40, United States Code.
