## AN ACT

To prohibit the award of contracts to provide guard services under the contract security guard program of the Federal Protective Service to a business concern that is owned, controlled, or operated by an individual who has been convicted of a felony.

## 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "Federal Protective
- 3 Service Guard Contracting Reform Act of 2007".
- 4 SEC. 2. FEDERAL PROTECTIVE SERVICE CONTRACTS.
- 5 (a) Prohibition on Award of Contracts to Any
- 6 Business Concern Owned, Controlled, or Oper-
- 7 ATED BY AN INDIVIDUAL CONVICTED OF A FELONY.—
- 8 The Secretary of Homeland Security may not award a
- 9 contract for the provision of guard services under the con-
- 10 tract security guard program of the Federal Protective
- 11 Service to any business concern that is owned, controlled,
- 12 or operated by an individual who has been convicted of
- 13 a felony.
- 14 (b) REGULATIONS.—Not later than 6 months after
- 15 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall
- 16 issue regulations to carry out this section.
- 17 (c) Implementation.—In this section, the term
- 18 "Secretary" means the Secretary of Homeland Security
- 19 acting through the Assistant Secretary of U.S. Immigra-
- 20 tion and Customs Enforcement.
