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## A BILL

To prohibit the award of contracts to provide guard services under the contract security guard program of the Federal Protective Service to a business concern that is owned, controlled, or operated by an individual who has been convicted of a felony.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Federal Protective  
3 Service Guard Contracting Reform Act of 2007”.

4 **SEC. 2. FEDERAL PROTECTIVE SERVICE CONTRACTS.**

5 (a) PROHIBITION ON AWARD OF CONTRACTS TO ANY  
6 BUSINESS CONCERN OWNED, CONTROLLED, OR OPER-  
7 ATED BY AN INDIVIDUAL CONVICTED OF A FELONY.—

8 The Secretary of Homeland Security may not award a  
9 contract for the provision of guard services under the con-  
10 tract security guard program of the Federal Protective  
11 Service to any business concern that is owned, controlled,  
12 or operated by an individual who has been convicted of  
13 a felony.

14 (b) REGULATIONS.—Not later than 6 months after  
15 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall  
16 issue regulations to carry out this section.

17 (c) REVIEW.—After the date of issuance of regula-  
18 tions under subsection (b), the Secretary shall review each  
19 contract described in subsection (a) that is in effect as  
20 of such date to ensure that the contract complies with the  
21 requirements of this section. If the Secretary determines  
22 that such a contract does not comply with the require-  
23 ments of this section, the Secretary shall terminate the  
24 contract and award a new contract that complies with  
25 such requirements.

1       (d) ~~IMPLEMENTATION.—In this section, the term~~  
 2   “Secretary” means the Secretary of Homeland Security  
 3   acting through the Assistant Secretary of U.S. Immigra-  
 4   tion and Customs Enforcement.

5   **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

6       *This Act may be cited as the “Federal Protective Serv-*  
 7   *ice Guard Contracting Reform Act of 2007”.*

8   **SEC. 2. FEDERAL PROTECTIVE SERVICE CONTRACTS.**

9       (a) *PROHIBITION ON AWARD OF CONTRACTS TO ANY*  
 10   *BUSINESS CONCERN OWNED, CONTROLLED, OR OPERATED*  
 11   *BY AN INDIVIDUAL CONVICTED OF A FELONY.—The Sec-*  
 12   *retary of Homeland Security may not award a contract*  
 13   *for the provision of guard services under the contract secu-*  
 14   *rity guard program of the Federal Protective Service to any*  
 15   *business concern that is owned, controlled, or operated by*  
 16   *an individual who has been convicted of a felony.*

17       (b) *REGULATIONS.—Not later than 6 months after the*  
 18   *date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall issue*  
 19   *regulations to carry out this section.*

20       (c) *IMPLEMENTATION.—In this section, the term “Sec-*  
 21   *retary” means the Secretary of Homeland Security acting*  
 22   *through the Assistant Secretary of U.S. Immigration and*  
 23   *Customs Enforcement.*

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
