A BILL

To eliminate methamphetamine kingpins.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Methamphetamine
- 5 Kingpin Elimination Act of 2007".

6 SEC. 2. TARGETING METHAMPHETAMINE KINGPINS.

- 7 (a) CONTINUING CRIMINAL ENTERPRISE.—Section
 8 408(s) of the Controlled Substances Act (21 U.S.C.
 9 848(s)) is amended—
- 10 (1) by striking "200" and inserting "100"; and

(2) by striking "5 million" and inserting "1
 2 million".

3 (b) CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES IMPORT AND EXPORT
4 ACT.—Section 1010(b)(1) of the Controlled Substances
5 Import and Export Act (21 U.S.C. 960(b)(1)) is amended
6 by adding at the end "In the case of a violation of sub7 paragraph (H), that portion of this paragraph which fol8 lows subparagraph (H) shall be read by substituting "20"
9 for '10' and '30' for '20'.".

10 SEC. 3. ASSISTANCE FOR MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL METH 11 AMPHETAMINE TASK FORCES.

12 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Attorney general, in con-13 sultation with appropriate State and local officials, shall—

(1) establish methamphetamine task forces,
consisting of Federal, State, and local law enforcement authorities, for the coordinated investigation,
disruption, apprehension, and prosecution of criminal gangs and offenders;

(2) direct the reassignment or detailing from
any Federal department or agency (subject to the
approval of the head of that department or agency,
in the case of a department or agency other than the
Department of Justice) of personnel to each task
force;
