A BILL

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Medicare Safe Needle
3 Disposal Coverage Act of 2007”.

4 **SEC. 2. COVERAGE OF HOME NEEDLE REMOVAL, DECON-**
5 **TAMINATION AND DISPOSAL DEVICES AND**
6 **DISPOSAL OF NEEDLES AND SYRINGES**
7 **THROUGH A SHARPS-BY-MAIL OR SIMILAR**
8 **PROGRAM UNDER MEDICARE PART D.**

9 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Section 1860D–2(e)(1)(B) of the
10 Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1395w–102(e)(1)(B)) is
11 amended by inserting after “regulations of the Secretary”
12 the following: “and including devices approved for home
13 use by the Food and Drug Administration for the safe
14 and effective removal, decontamination and disposal of
15 needles and the disposal of needles and syringes through
16 a sharps-by-mail or similar program as medically appro-
17 priate based on volume of usage”.

18 (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendment made by
19 subsection (a) shall take effect on January 1, 2008.
