- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Toll Road Prohibition
- 5 Act of 2007".
- 6 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON COLLECTION OF TOLLS.
- 7 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, after the
- 8 date of enactment of this Act, no toll may be collected
- 9 for the use of a highway, bridge, or tunnel constructed

- 1 (as defined in section 101 of title 23, United States Code)
- 2 in whole or in part using Federal funds unless the total
- 3 amount of such Federal funds, including reasonable inter-
- 4 est thereon, is repaid to the United States from non-Fed-

5 eral sources.
