3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Captain Scott Corwin
- 5 Armed Forces Protection Act of 2007".

6 SEC. 2. DECLARATION OF PURPOSE.

7 Congress hereby declares that the protection of mem8 bers of the armed forces from violent crime is important
9 to maintain public safety. In recognition of this need, Con10 gress hereby recognizes the sacrifice made by Captain

Scott Corwin, West Point class of 1999, who was mur dered.

3 SEC. 3. PROTECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE ARMED 4 FORCES.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 51 of title 18, United
6 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol7 lowing:

8 "§ 1123. Murder of member of the Armed Forces

9 "Whoever kills, or conspires or attempts to kill, any
10 member of the Armed Forces of the United States, shall
11 be punished—

12 "(1) in the case of murder, as provided under13 section 1111;

14 "(2) in the case of manslaughter, as provided15 under section 1112;

16 "(3) in the case of attempted murder or man17 slaughter, as provided under section 1113; or

18 "(4) in the case of conspiracy to commit mur-19 der, as provided under section 1117.".

20 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
21 for such chapter is amended by adding at the end the fol22 lowing:

"1123. Murder of member of the Armed Forces.".

23 SEC. 4. ADDITION OF AGGRAVATING FACTOR.

24 Section 3592(c) of title 18, United States Code, is 25 amended by adding at the end the following: "(17) KILLING OF MEMBER OF THE ARMED
 FORCES.—The defendant killed or attempted to kill
 a member of the Armed Forces of the United
 States.".
