- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Protecting Consumers
- 5 through Proper Forbearance Procedures Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF FORBEARANCE PETITION CONSID-
- 7 ERATION.
- 8 Section 10(c) of the Communications Act of 1934 (47
- 9 U.S.C. 160(c)) is amended by striking the second and

- 1 third sentences and inserting the following: "The Commis-
- 2 sion shall grant or deny any such petition within one year
- 3 after the Commission receives it, except that the Commis-
- 4 sion may extend the one-year period for an additional 90
- 5 days if the Commission finds that the extension is nec-
- 6 essary to meet the requirements of subsection (a).".
