A BILL

To temporarily extend the programs under the Higher Education Act of 1965, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the “Third Higher Edu-
5 cation Extension Act of 2007”.

6 SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF PROGRAMS.

7 Section 2(a) of the Higher Education Extension Act
8 of 2005 (Public Law 109–81; 20 U.S.C. 1001 note) is

1 amended by striking “October 31, 2007” and inserting
2 “April 30, 2008”.

3 **SEC. 3. RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.**

4 Nothing in this Act, or in the Higher Education Ex-
5 tension Act of 2005 as amended by this Act, shall be con-
6 strued to limit or otherwise alter the authorizations of ap-
7 propriations for, or the durations of, programs contained
8 in the amendments made by the Higher Education Rec-
9 onciliation Act of 2005 (Public Law 109–171) and the
10 College Cost Reduction and Access Act of 2007 (Public
11 Law 110–84) to the provisions of the Higher Education
12 Act of 1965 and the Taxpayer-Teacher Protection Act of
13 2004.
