1 **TITLE I—HARRY S TRUMAN** 2 **BIRTHPLACE STUDY ACT**

3 SEC. 101. SHORT TITLE.

4 This title may be cited as the "Harry S Truman5 Birthplace Study Act".

6 SEC. 102. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall complete a
8 special resource study of the Harry S Truman Birthplace
9 State Historic Site in Lamar, Missouri to determine—

(1) the suitability and feasibility of adding the
birthplace site to the Harry S Truman National Historic Site or designating the site as a separate unit
of the National Park System; and

(2) the methods and means for the protection
and interpretation of the Harry S Truman Birthplace State Historic Site by the National Park Service, other Federal, State, or local government entities or private or non-profit organizations.

(b) STUDY REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall
conduct the study in accordance with section 8(c) of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5).

(c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date
 on which funds are made available to carry out this Act,
 the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Natural
 Resources of the House of Representatives and the Com mittee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate
 a report containing—

12 **SEC. 201. SHORT TITLE.**

13 This title may be cited as the "Lewis and Clark Na-14 tional Historic Trail Extension Study Act".

15 SEC. 202. DEFINITIONS.

16 In this title:

17 (1) EASTERN LEGACY SITES.—The term "East-18 ern Legacy sites" means the sites associated with 19 the preparation or return phases of the Lewis and 20 Clark expedition, commonly known as the "Eastern 21 Legacy", including sites in Virginia, the District of 22 Columbia, Maryland, Delaware, Pennsylvania, West 23 Virginia, Ohio, Kentucky, Tennessee, Indiana, Mis-24 souri, and Illinois. This includes the routes followed

by Meriwether Lewis and William Clark, whether
 independently or together.

3 (2) TRAIL.—The term "Trail" means the Lewis
4 and Clark National Historic Trail designated by sec5 tion 5(a)(6) of the National Trails System Act (16
6 U.S.C. 1244(a)(6)).

7 SEC. 203. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall complete a 9 special resource study of the Eastern Legacy sites to de-10 termine—

(1) the suitability and feasibility of addingthese sites to the Trail; and

(2) the methods and means for the protection
and interpretation of these sites by the National
Park Service, other Federal, State, or local government entities or private or non-profit organizations.
(b) STUDY REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall
conduct the study in accordance with section 5(b) of the
National Trails System Act (16 U.S.C. 1244(b)).

(c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date
on which funds are made available to carry out this title,
the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Natural
Resources of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate
a report containing—

(1) the results of the study; and (2) any recommendations of the Secretary. **TITLE III—BATTLE OF MATEWAN STUDY ACT**

5 SEC. 301. SHORT TITLE.

6 This title may be cited as the "Battle of Matewan7 Study Act".

8 SEC. 302. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.

9 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall complete a 10 special resource study of the sites and resources at 11 Matewan, West Virginia, associated with the Battle of 12 Matewan (also known as the Matewan Massacre) of May 13 19, 1920 to determine—

(1) the suitability and feasibility of designating
certain historic areas of Matewan, West Virginia as
a unit of the National Park System; and

(2) the methods and means for the protection
and interpretation of these sites by the National
Park Service, other Federal, State, or local government entities or private or non-profit organizations.
(b) STUDY REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall
conduct the study in accordance with section 8(c) of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5).

24 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date25 on which funds are made available to carry out this title,

the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Natural
 Resources of the House of Representatives and the Com mittee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate
 a report containing—

5 (1) the results of the study; and

6 (2) any recommendations of the Secretary.

7 TITLE IV—BATTLE OF CAMDEN 8 STUDY ACT

9 SEC. 401. SHORT TITLE.

10 This title may be cited as the "Battle of Camden11 Study Act".

12 SEC. 402. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall complete a
special resource study of the site of the Battle of Camden
fought in South Carolina on August 16, 1780, and the
site of Historic Camden, which is currently a National
Park System Affiliated Area, to determine—

18 (1) the suitability and feasibility of designating
19 these sites as a unit or units of the National Park
20 System; and

(2) the methods and means for the protection
and interpretation of these sites by the National
Park Service, other Federal, State, or local government entities or private or non-profit organizations.

(b) STUDY REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall
 conduct the study in accordance with section 8(c) of Pub lic Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5).

4 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date
5 on which funds are made available to carry out this title,
6 the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Natural
7 Resources of the House of Representatives and the Com8 mittee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate
9 a report containing—

10 (1) the results of the study; and

11 (2) any recommendations of the Secretary.

12 TITLE V—MISSISSIPPI RIVER 13 STUDY ACT

14 SEC. 501. SHORT TITLE.

15 This title may be cited as the "Mississippi River16 Study Act".

17 SEC. 502. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall complete a
special resource study along the route of the Mississippi
River in the counties contiguous to the river from its headwaters in the State of Minnesota to the Gulf of Mexico
to evaluate—

(1) a range of alternatives for protecting and
interpreting the resources along the route of the
Mississippi River, including alternatives for potential

addition of all or portions of the route to the Na tional Trails System; and

3 (2) the methods and means for the protection
4 and interpretation of the route by the National Park
5 Service, other Federal, State, or local government
6 entities or private or non-profit organizations.

7 (b) STUDY REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall
8 conduct the study in accordance with section 8 (c) of Pub9 lic Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5) or section 5(b) of the
10 National Trails System Act (16 U.S.C. 1244(b)) as appro11 priate.

(c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date
on which funds are made available to carry out this title,
the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Natural
Resources of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate
a report containing—

18 (1) the results of the study; and

19 (2) any recommendations of the Secretary.

20 TITLE VI—FORT SAN GERONIMO 21 STUDY ACT

22 SEC. 601. SHORT TITLE.

23 This title may be cited as the "Fort San Gerónimo24 Study Act".

1 SEC. 602. DEFINITIONS.

2 For the purposes of this title:

3 (1) FORT SAN GERÓNIMO.—The term "Fort 4 San Gerónimo" (also known as "Fortín de San 5 Gerónimo del Boquerón") means the fort and grounds listed on the National Register of Historic 6 7 Places and located near Old San Juan, Puerto Rico. (2) RELATED RESOURCES.—The term "related 8 resources" means other parts of the fortification sys-9 10 tem of old San Juan that are not currently included 11 within the boundary of San Juan National Historic 12 Site, such as sections of the City Wall or other for-13 tifications.

14 SEC. 603. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall complete a
special resource study of Fort San Gerónimo and other
related resources, to determine—

(1) the suitability and feasibility of including
Fort San Gerónimo and other related resources in
the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico as part of San
Juan National Historic Site; and

(2) the methods and means for the protection
and interpretation of Fort San Gerónimo and other
related resources by the National Park Service,
other Federal, State, or local government entities or
private or non-profit organizations.

(b) STUDY REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall
 conduct the study in accordance with section 8(c) of Pub lic Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5).

4 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date
5 on which funds are made available to carry out this title,
6 the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Natural
7 Resources of the House of Representatives and the Com8 mittee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate
9 a report containing—

10 (1) the results of the study; and

11 (2) any recommendations of the Secretary.

12 TITLE VII—WOLF HOUSE STUDY 13 ACT

14 SEC. 701. SHORT TITLE.

15 This title may be cited as the "Wolf House Study16 Act".

17 SEC. 702. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall complete a
special resource study of the Wolf House located on Highway 5 in Norfork, Arkansas, to determine—

(1) the suitability and feasibility of designating
the Wolf House as a unit of the National Park System; and

24 (2) the methods and means for the protection25 and interpretation of the Wolf House by the Na-

tional Park Service, other Federal, State, or local
 government entities or private or non-profit organi zations.

4 (b) STUDY REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall
5 conduct the study in accordance with section 8(c) of Pub6 lic Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5).

7 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date
8 on which funds are made available to carry out this title,
9 the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Natural
10 Resources of the House of Representatives and the Com11 mittee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate
12 a report containing—

13 (1) the results of the study; and

14 (2) any recommendations of the Secretary.

15 TITLE VIII—RIM OF THE VALLEY 16 CORRIDOR STUDY ACT

17 SEC. 801. SHORT TITLE.

18 This title may be cited as the "Rim of the Valley Cor-19 ridor Study Act".

20 SEC. 802. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall complete a
special resource study of the area known as the Rim of
the Valley Corridor, generally including the mountains encircling the San Fernando, La Crescenta, Santa Clarita,
Simi, and Conejo Valleys in California, to determine—

(1) the suitability and feasibility of designating
 all or a portion of the corridor as a unit of the
 Santa Monica Mountains National Recreation Area;
 and

5 (2) the methods and means for the protection
6 and interpretation of this corridor by the National
7 Park Service, other Federal, State, or local govern8 ment entities or private or non-profit organizations.
9 (b) STUDY REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall
10 conduct the study in accordance with section 8(c) of Pub11 lie Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5).

(c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date
on which funds are made available to carry out this title,
the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Natural
Resources of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate
a report containing—

18 (1) the results of the study; and

19 (2) any recommendations of the Secretary.

20 TITLE IX—STRANAHAN HOUSE, 21 TRADING POST AND CAMP22 SITE STUDY ACT

23 **SEC. 901. SHORT TITLE.**

24 This title may be cited as the "Stranahan House,25 Trading Post and Campsite Study Act".

1 SEC. 902. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall complete a
special resource study of the Stranahan House, located at
335 S.E. 6th Avenue, Fort Lauderdale, Florida, as well
as the adjacent property at 500 East Las Olas Boulevard,
where portions of the trading post and the campsite were
located, to determine—

8 (1) the suitability and feasibility of designating
9 these sites as a unit of the National Park System;
10 and

(2) the methods and means for the protection
and interpretation of these sites by the National
Park Service, other Federal, State, or local government entities or private or non-profit organizations.
(b) STUDY REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall
conduct the study in accordance with section 8(c) of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5).

(c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date
on which funds are made available to carry out this title,
the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Natural
Resources of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate
a report containing—

24 (1) the results of the study; and

25 (2) any recommendations of the Secretary.

TITLE X—BUTTERFIELD OVERLAND TRAIL STUDY ACT

3 SEC. 1001. SHORT TITLE.

4 This title may be cited as the "Butterfield Overland5 Trail Study Act".

6 SEC. 1002. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall complete a
8 special resource study along the "Ox-Bow Route" of the
9 Butterfield Overland Trail in the States of Missouri, Ten10 nessee, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Texas, New Mexico, Ari11 zona, and California to evaluate—

(1) a range of alternatives for protecting and
interpreting the resources of the trail area, including
alternatives for potential addition of the trail area to
the National Trails System; and

(2) the methods and means for the protection
and interpretation of this trail by the National Park
Service, other Federal, State, or local government
entities or private or non-profit organizations.

(b) STUDY REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall
conduct the study in accordance with section 8(c) of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5) or section 5(b) of the
National Trails System Act (16 U.S.C. 1244(b)) as appropriate.

(c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date
 on which funds are made available to carry out this title,
 the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Natural
 Resources of the House of Representatives and the Com mittee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate
 a report containing—

- 7 (1) the results of the study; and
- 8 (2) any recommendations of the Secretary.
