A BILL

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall complete a spe8 cial resource study of the Harry S Truman Birthplace
9 State Historic Site in Lamar, Missouri, to determine—

10 (1) the suitability and feasibility of adding the

11 birthplace site to the Harry S Truman National His-

- 12 toric Site or designating the site as a separate unit
- 13 of the National Park System; and
- 14 (2) the methods and means for the protection
- 15 and interpretation of the Harry S Truman Birth-

3	Virginia, Ohio, Kentucky, Tennessee, Indiana, Mis-
4	souri, and Illinois. This includes the routes followed
5	by Meriwether Lewis and William Clark, whether
6	independently or together.
7	(2) TRAIL.—The term "Trail" means the Lewis
8	and Clark National Historic Trail designated by sec-
9	tion $5(a)(6)$ of the National Trails System Act (16
10	$U.S.C. \ 1244(a)(6)).$
11	SEC. 203. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.
12	(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall complete a spe-
13	cial resource study of the Eastern Legacy sites to deter-
14	mine—
15	(1) the suitability and feasibility of adding these
16	sites to the Trail; and
17	(2) the methods and means for the protection
18	and interpretation of these sites by the National Park
19	Service, other Federal, State, or local government en-
20	tities or private or non-profit organizations.
21	(b) Study Requirements.—The Secretary shall con-
22	duct the study in accordance with section 5(b) of the Na-
23	tional Trails System Act (16 U.S.C. 1244(b)).
24	(c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date on

7 TITLE III—BATTLE OF MATEWAN 8 STUDY ACT

9 SEC. 301. SHORT TITLE.

10 This title may be cited as the "Battle of Matewan11 Study Act".

12 SEC. 302. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall complete a special resource study of the sites and resources at Matewan,
West Virginia, associated with the Battle of Matewan (also
known as the Matewan Massacre) of May 19, 1920, to determine—

(1) the suitability and feasibility of designating
certain historic areas of Matewan, West Virginia, as
a unit of the National Park System; and

(2) the methods and means for the protection
and interpretation of these sites by the National Park
Service, other Federal, State, or local government entities or private or non-profit organizations.

(b) STUDY REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall con duct the study in accordance with section 8(c) of Public
 Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5).

4 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date on
5 which funds are made available to carry out this title, the
6 Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Natural Re7 sources of the House of Representatives and the Committee
8 on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate a report

TITLE IV—BATTLE OF CAMDEN STUDY ACT

14 SEC. 401. SHORT TITLE.

15 This title may be cited as the "Battle of Camden Study16 Act".

17 SEC. 402. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall complete a special resource study of the site of the Battle of Camden fought
in South Carolina on August 16, 1780, and the site of Historic Camden, which is currently a National Park System
Affiliated Area, to determine—

23 (1) the suitability and feasibility of designating
24 these sites as a unit or units of the National Park
25 System; and

1 (2) the methods and means for the protection 2 and interpretation of these sites by the National Park 3 Service, other Federal, State, or local government en-4 tities or private or non-profit organizations. 5 (b) STUDY REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall conduct the study in accordance with section 8(c) of Public 6 7 Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5). 8 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date on 9 which funds are made available to carry out this title, the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Natural Re-10 sources of the House of Representatives and the Committee 11 on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate a report 12 containing— 13 14 (1) the results of the study; and 15 (2) any recommendations of the Secretary. TITLE V—MISSISSIPPI RIVER 16

17 **STUDY ACT**

18 SEC. 501. SHORT TITLE.

19 This title may be cited as the "Mississippi River Study20 Act".

21 SEC. 502. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall complete a special resource study along the route of the Mississippi River
in the counties contiguous to the river from its headwaters

in the State of Minnesota to the Gulf of Mexico to evalu ate—

3 (1) a range of alternatives for protecting and in4 terpreting the resources along the route of the Mis5 sissippi River, including alternatives for potential
6 addition of all or portions of the route to the National
7 Trails System; and

8 (2) the methods and means for the protection
9 and interpretation of the route by the National Park
10 Service, other Federal, State, or local government en11 tities or private or non-profit organizations.

(b) STUDY REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall conduct the study in accordance with section 8 (c) of Public
Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5) or section 5(b) of the National Trails System Act (16 U.S.C. 1244(b)) as appropriate.

(c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date on
which funds are made available to carry out this title, the
Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Natural Resources of the House of Representatives and the Committee
on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate a report
containing—

- 23 (1) the results of the study; and
- 24 (2) any recommendations of the Secretary.

TITLE VI—FORT SAN GERONIMO STUDY ACT

3 SEC. 601. SHORT TITLE.

4 This title may be cited as the "Fort San Gerónimo
5 Study Act".

6 SEC. 602. DEFINITIONS.

7 For the purposes of this title:

8 (1) FORT SAN GERÓNIMO.—The term "Fort San
9 Gerónimo" (also known as "Fortín de San Gerónimo
10 del Boquerón") means the fort and grounds listed on
11 the National Register of Historic Places and located
12 near Old San Juan, Puerto Rico.

(2) RELATED RESOURCES.—The term "related
resources" means other parts of the fortification system of old San Juan that are not currently included
within the boundary of San Juan National Historic
Site, such as sections of the City Wall or other fortifications.

19 SEC. 603. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.

20 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall complete a spe21 cial resource study of Fort San Gerónimo and other related
22 resources, to determine—

23 (1) the suitability and feasibility of including
24 Fort San Gerónimo and other related resources in the

Commonwealth of Puerto Rico as part of San Juan 1 2 National Historic Site; and (2) the methods and means for the protection 3 4 and interpretation of Fort San Gerónimo and other 5 related resources by the National Park Service, other 6 Federal, State, or local government entities or private 7 or non-profit organizations. 8 (b) STUDY REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall con-9 duct the study in accordance with section 8(c) of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5). 10 11 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date on 12 which funds are made available to carry out this title, the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Natural Re-13 sources of the House of Representatives and the Committee 14 15 on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate a report 16 containing— 17 (1) the results of the study; and

18 (2) any recommendations of the Secretary.

19 *TITLE VII—WOLF HOUSE STUDY*20 *ACT*

21 SEC. 701. SHORT TITLE.

22 This title may be cited as the "Wolf House Study Act".

SEC. 702. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall complete a spe3 cial resource study of the Wolf House located on Highway
4 5 in Norfork, Arkansas, to determine—

5 (1) the suitability and feasibility of designating
6 the Wolf House as a unit of the National Park Sys7 tem; and

8 (2) the methods and means for the protection 9 and interpretation of the Wolf House by the National 10 Park Service, other Federal, State, or local govern-11 ment entities or private or non-profit organizations. 12 (b) STUDY REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall con-13 duct the study in accordance with section 8(c) of Public 14 Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5).

(c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date on
which funds are made available to carry out this title, the
Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Natural Resources of the House of Representatives and the Committee
on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate a report
containing—

21 (1) the results of the study; and

22 (2) any recommendations of the Secretary.

TITLE VIII—RIM OF THE VALLEY CORRIDOR STUDY ACT

3 SEC. 801. SHORT TITLE.

4 This title may be cited as the "Rim of the Valley Cor5 ridor Study Act".

6 SEC. 802. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall complete a spe8 cial resource study of the area known as the Rim of the
9 Valley Corridor, generally including the mountains encir10 cling the San Fernando, La Crescenta, Santa Clarita,
11 Simi, and Conejo Valleys in California, to determine—

(1) the suitability and feasibility of designating
all or a portion of the corridor as a unit of the Santa
Monica Mountains National Recreation Area; and

(2) the methods and means for the protection
and interpretation of this corridor by the National
Park Service, other Federal, State, or local government entities or private or non-profit organizations.
(b) DOCUMENTATION.—In conducting the study authorized under subsection (a), the Secretary shall document—

(1) the process used to develop the existing Santa
Monica Mountains National Recreation Area Fire
Management Plan and Environmental Impact Statement (September 2005); and

(2) all activity conducted pursuant to the plan
 referred to in paragraph (1) designed to protect lives
 and property from wildfire.

4 (c) STUDY REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall con5 duct the study in accordance with section 8(c) of Public
6 Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5).

7 (d) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date
8 on which funds are made available to carry out this title,
9 the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Natural Re10 sources of the House of Representatives and the Committee
11 on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate a report
12 containing—

13 (1) the results of the study; and

14 (2) any recommendations of the Secretary.

15 TITLE IX—STRANAHAN HOUSE, 16 TRADING POST AND CAMP17 SITE STUDY ACT

18 SEC. 901. SHORT TITLE.

19 This title may be cited as the "Stranahan House,20 Trading Post and Campsite Study Act".

21 SEC. 902. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall complete a special resource study of the Stranahan House, located at 335
S.E. 6th Avenue, Fort Lauderdale, Florida, as well as the
adjacent property at 500 East Las Olas Boulevard, where

portions of the trading post and the campsite were located,
 to determine—

(1) the suitability and feasibility of designating 3 4 these sites as a unit of the National Park System; and 5 (2) the methods and means for the protection 6 and interpretation of these sites by the National Park Service, other Federal, State, or local government en-7 8 tities or private or non-profit organizations. 9 (b) STUDY REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall con-10 duct the study in accordance with section 8(c) of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5). 11 12 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date on 13 which funds are made available to carry out this title, the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Natural Re-14 15 sources of the House of Representatives and the Committee

16 on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate a report17 containing—

18 (1) the results of the study; and

19 (2) any recommendations of the Secretary.

20 TITLE X—BUTTERFIELD

21 OVERLAND TRAIL STUDY ACT

22 SEC. 1001. SHORT TITLE.

23 This title may be cited as the "Butterfield Overland
24 Trail Study Act".

1 SEC. 1002. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall complete a spe3 cial resource study along the "Ox-Bow Route" of the
4 Butterfield Overland Trail in the States of Missouri, Ten5 nessee, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Texas, New Mexico, Arizona,
6 and California to evaluate—

7 (1) a range of alternatives for protecting and in8 terpreting the resources of the trail area, including al9 ternatives for potential addition of the trail area to
10 the National Trails System; and

(2) the methods and means for the protection
and interpretation of this trail by the National Park
Service, other Federal, State, or local government entities or private or non-profit organizations.

(b) STUDY REQUIREMENTS.—The Secretary shall conduct the study in accordance with section 8(c) of Public
Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–5) or section 5(b) of the National Trails System Act (16 U.S.C. 1244(b)) as appropriate.

(c) REPORT.—Not later than 3 years after the date on
which funds are made available to carry out this title, the
Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Natural Resources of the House of Representatives and the Committee
on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate a report
containing—

4 SEC. 1101. HUNTING AND FISHING.

5 Each study authorized by this Act shall document the
6 State and local laws governing hunting and fishing within
7 the study area.

8 TITLE XII—SENSE OF CONGRESS

9 SEC. 1201. SENSE OF CONGRESS.

10 It is the sense of Congress that any subsequent legisla-11 tion affecting the status of the areas subject to the special 12 resources studies authorized under this Act shall be sup-13 ported by the results of the relevant studies authorized by 14 this Act.
