3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Free Competition in
- 5 Currency Act of 2007".

6 SEC. 2. REPEAL OF SUPERFLUOUS SECTIONS.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Title 18, United States Code, is
8 amended by striking sections 486 (relating to uttering
9 coins of gold, silver, or other metal) and 489 (making or
10 possessing likeness of coins).

(b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT TO TABLE OF SEC TIONS.—The table of sections at the beginning of chapter
 25 of title 18, United States Code, is amended by striking
 the items relating to the sections stricken by subsection
 (a).

6 (c) SPECIAL RULE CONCERNING RETROACTIVE EF7 FECT.—Any prosecution under the sections stricken by
8 subsection (a) shall abate upon the taking effect of this
9 Act. Any previous conviction under those sections shall be
10 null and void.
