A BILL

3 **SECTION 1. MANDATORY REVOCATION OF PASSPORTS OF**
4 **INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE MORE THAN \$5,000 IN**
5 **ARREARS IN CHILD SUPPORT PAYMENTS.**

6 Section 452(k) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
7 652(k)) is amended—

1 (1) in paragraph (1), by striking “, revocation,
2 or limitation” and inserting “or revocation”; and

3 (2) in paragraph (2), by striking “may revoke,
4 restrict, or limit” and inserting “shall revoke”.
