AN ACT

- To establish the Commission to Study the Potential Creation of the National Museum of the American Latino to develop a plan of action for the establishment and maintenance of a National Museum of the American Latino in Washington, DC, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Commission to Study
5 the Potential Creation of the National Museum of the
6 American Latino Act of 2007".

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1 SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMISSION.

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—There is established the Commis3 sion to Study the Potential Creation of a National Mu4 seum of the American Latino (hereafter in this Act re5 ferred to as the "Commission").

6 (b) MEMBERSHIP.—The Commission shall consist of
7 23 members appointed not later than 6 months after the
8 date of the enactment of this Act as follows:

9 (1) The President shall appoint 7 voting mem-10 bers.

(2) The Speaker of the House of Representatives, the minority leader of the House of Representatives, the majority leader of the Senate, and the minority leader of the Senate shall each appoint 3 voting members.

16 (3) In addition to the members appointed under
17 paragraph (2), the Speaker of the House of Rep18 resentatives, the minority leader of the House of
19 Representatives, the majority leader of the Senate,
20 and the minority leader of the Senate shall each ap21 point 1 nonvoting member.

(c) QUALIFICATIONS.—Members of the Commission
shall be chosen from among individuals, or representatives
of institutions or entities, who possess either—

(1) a demonstrated commitment to the re-search, study, or promotion of American Latino life,

3	(A) expertise in museum administration;
4	(B) expertise in fundraising for nonprofit

6	(C) experience in the study and teaching of

3 (b) FUNDRAISING PLAN.—The Commission shall de4 velop a fundraising plan for supporting the creation and
5 maintenance of the Museum through contributions by the
6 American people, and a separate plan on fundraising by
7 the American Latino community.

8 (c) REPORT ON ISSUES.—The Commission shall ex-9 amine (in consultation with the Secretary of the Smithso-10 nian Institution), and submit a report to the President 11 and the Congress on, the following issues:

12 (1) The availability and cost of collections to be13 acquired and housed in the Museum.

14 (2) The impact of the Museum on regional15 Hispanic- and Latino-related museums.

(3) Possible locations for the Museum in Washington, DC and its environs, to be considered in consultation with the National Capital Planning Commission and the Commission of Fine Arts, the Department of the Interior and Smithsonian Institution.

(4) Whether the Museum should be locatedwithin the Smithsonian Institution.

24 (5) The governance and organizational struc-25 ture from which the Museum should operate.

(6) How to engage the American Latino com munity in the development and design of the Mu seum.

4 (7) The cost of constructing, operating, and5 maintaining the Museum.

6 (d) LEGISLATION TO CARRY OUT PLAN OF AC-7 TION.—Based on the recommendations contained in the 8 report submitted under subsection (a) and the report sub-9 mitted under subsection (c), the Commission shall submit 10 for consideration to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure of the House of Representatives, the Com-11 12 mittee on House Administration of the House of Rep-13 resentatives, the Committee on Rules and Administration of the Senate, the Committee on Natural Resources of the 14 15 House of Representatives, the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate, and the Committees on 16 17 Appropriations of the House of Representatives and the Senate recommendations for a legislative plan of action 18 19 to create and construct the Museum.

(e) NATIONAL CONFERENCE.—In carrying out its
functions under this section, the Commission may convene
a national conference on the Museum, comprised of individuals committed to the advancement of American Latino
life, art, history, and culture, not later than 18 months
after the commission members are selected.

SEC. 4. ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS.

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(a) FACILITIES AND SUPPORT OF DEPARTMENT OF
THE INTERIOR.—The Department of the Interior shall
provide from funds appropriated for this purpose administrative services, facilities, and funds necessary for the performance of the Commission's functions. These funds shall
be made available prior to any meetings of the Commis8 sion.

9 (b) COMPENSATION.—Each member of the Commis-10 sion who is not an officer or employee of the Federal Gov-11 ernment may receive compensation for each day on which 12 the member is engaged in the work of the Commission, 13 at a daily rate to be determined by the Secretary of the 14 Interior.

(c) TRAVEL EXPENSES.—Each member shall be entitled to travel expenses, including per diem in lieu of subsistence, in accordance with applicable provisions under
subchapter I of chapter 57 of title 5, United States Code.
(d) FEDERAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE ACT.—The
Commission is not subject to the provisions of the Federal
Advisory Committee Act.

22 SEC. 5. DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION OF REPORTS; TERMI23 NATION.

(a) DEADLINE.—The Commission shall submit finalversions of the reports and plans required under section

3 not later than 24 months after the date of the Commis 2 sion's first meeting.

3 (b) TERMINATION.—The Commission shall terminate
4 not later than 30 days after submitting the final versions
5 of reports and plans pursuant to subsection (a).

6 SEC. 6. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

7 There are authorized to be appropriated for carrying 8 out the activities of the Commission \$2,100,000 for the 9 first fiscal year beginning after the date of the enactment 10 of this Act and \$1,100,000 for the second fiscal year be-11 ginning after the date of the enactment of this Act.

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
