# A BILL

- To authorize the American Battle Monuments Commission to establish a memorial, in the District of Columbia or its environs, to honor members of the Armed Forces who served in World War I, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Frank Buckles World
  - 5 War I Memorial Act".
  - 6 SEC. 2. AUTHORITY TO ESTABLISH MEMORIAL.
  - 7 (a) In General.—The American Battle Monuments
  - 8 Commission (hereinafter in this Act referred to as the

- 1 "Commission") is authorized to establish a memorial to
- 2 honor members of the Armed Forces who served in World
- 3 War I and to commemorate the participation of the United
- 4 States in that war.
- 5 (b) Location of Memorial.—The memorial estab-
- 6 lished pursuant to this Act shall be—
- 7 (1) located generally on and abutting the Fed-
- 8 eral land in the District of Columbia where the Dis-
- 9 trict of Columbia War Memorial is currently located;
- 10 and
- 11 (2) incorporated with the District of Columbia
- War Memorial.
- 13 (c) Compliance With Standards for Commemo-
- 14 RATIVE WORKS.—The establishment of the memorial shall
- 15 be in accordance with chapter 89 of title 40, United States
- 16 Code.
- 17 (d) Handicapped Access.—The plan, design, con-
- 18 struction, and operation of the memorial pursuant to this
- 19 section shall provide for accessibility by, and accommoda-
- 20 tions for, the physically handicapped.
- 21 SEC. 3. ADVISORY BOARD.
- 22 (a) Establishment of Board.—There is hereby
- 23 established a World War I Memorial Advisory Board, con-
- 24 sisting of 12 members, who shall be appointed by the
- 25 President from among veterans of World War I, historians

- 1 of World War I, and representatives of veterans organiza-
- 2 tions, historical associations, and groups knowledgeable
- 3 about World War I.
- 4 (b) APPOINTMENTS.—Members of the Board shall be
- 5 appointed not later than 3 months after the date of the
- 6 enactment of this Act and shall serve for the life of the
- 7 Board. The President shall make appointments to fill such
- 8 vacancies as may occur on the Board.
- 9 (c) Responsibilities of the Board.—The Board
- 10 shall—
- 11 (1) in the manner specified by the Commission,
- promote establishment of the memorial and encour-
- age donation of private contributions for the memo-
- rial; and
- 15 (2) upon the request of the Commission, advise
- the Commission on the site and design for the me-
- 17 morial.
- 18 (d) Sunset.—The Board shall cease to exist on the
- 19 last day of the third month after the month in which the
- 20 memorial is completed or the month of the expiration of
- 21 the authority for the memorial under chapter 89 of title
- 22 40, United States Code, whichever first occurs.
- 23 SEC. 4. PRIVATE CONTRIBUTIONS.
- The Commission shall solicit and accept private con-
- 25 tributions for the memorial.

### 1 SEC. 5. FUND IN THE TREASURY FOR THE MEMORIAL.

- 2 (a) IN GENERAL.—There is hereby created in the
- 3 Treasury a fund which shall be available to the Commis-
- 4 sion for the expenses of establishing the memorial. The
- 5 fund shall consist of—
- 6 (1) amounts deposited, and interest and pro-
- 7 ceeds credited, under subsection (b); and
- 8 (2) obligations obtained under subsection (c).
- 9 (b) Deposits and Credits.—The Chairman of the
- 10 Commission shall deposit in the fund the amounts accept-
- 11 ed as contributions under section 4. The Secretary of the
- 12 Treasury shall credit to the fund the interest on, and the
- 13 proceeds from sale or redemption of, obligations held in
- 14 the fund.
- 15 (c) Obligations.—The Secretary of the Treasury
- 16 shall invest any portion of the fund that, as determined
- 17 by the Chairman of the Commission, is not required to
- 18 meet current expenses. Each investment shall be made in
- 19 an interest bearing obligation of the United States or an
- 20 obligation guaranteed as to principal and interest by the
- 21 United States that, as determined by the Chairman of the
- 22 Commission, has a maturity suitable for the fund.
- 23 (d) Abolition.—Upon the final settlement of the ac-
- 24 counts of the fund, the Secretary of the Treasury shall
- 25 submit to the Congress a draft of legislation (including

- 1 technical and conforming provisions) recommended by the
- 2 Secretary for the abolition of the fund.

#### 3 SEC. 6. DEPOSIT OF EXCESS FUNDS.

- 4 If, upon payment of all expenses of the establishment
- 5 of the memorial (including the maintenance and preserva-
- 6 tion amount provided for in chapter 89 of title 40, United
- 7 States Code), or upon expiration of the authority for the
- 8 memorial under chapter 89 of title 40, United States
- 9 Code, there remains a balance in the fund created by sec-
- 10 tion 5, the Chairman of the Commission shall transmit
- 11 the amount of the balance to the Secretary of the Treas-
- 12 ury for deposit in the account provided for in chapter 89
- 13 of title 40, United States Code.

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
