AN ACT

- To amend title 38, United States Code, to improve the outreach activities of the Department of Veterans Affairs, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Veterans Outreach Im-3 provement Act of 2007".

4 SEC. 2. IMPROVEMENT OF OUTREACH ACTIVITIES WITHIN 5 DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS.

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 5 of title 38, United
7 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol8 lowing new subchapter:

9 "SUBCHAPTER IV—OUTREACH ACTIVITIES

10 "§ 561. Outreach activities: coordination of activities 11 within the Department

"(a) COORDINATION PROCEDURES.—The Secretary
shall establish and maintain procedures for ensuring the
effective coordination of the outreach activities of the Department between and among the following:

- 16 "(1) The Office of the Secretary.
- 17 "(2) The Office of Public Affairs.
- 18 "(3) The Veterans Health Administration.
- 19 "(4) The Veterans Benefits Administration.
- 20 "(5) The National Cemetery Administration.

21 "(b) ANNUAL REVIEW OF PROCEDURES.—The Sec-22 retary shall—

"(1) annually review the procedures in effect
under subsection (a) for the purpose of ensuring
that those procedures meet the requirements of that
subsection; and

"(2) make such modifications to those proce dures as the Secretary considers appropriate in light
 of such review in order to better achieve that pur pose.

5 "§ 562. Outreach activities: cooperative activities with States; grants to States for improvement of outreach

"(a) PURPOSE.—It is the purpose of this section to 8 9 provide for assistance by the Secretary to State and coun-10 ty veterans agencies to carry out programs in locations within the respective jurisdictions of such agencies that 11 12 offer a high probability of improving outreach and assist-13 ance to veterans, and to the spouses, children, and parents of veterans, to ensure that such individuals are fully in-14 15 formed about, and assisted in applying for, any veterans' 16 and veterans-related benefits and programs (including 17 State veterans' programs) for which they may be eligible. 18 "(b) PRIORITY FOR AREAS WITH HIGH CONCENTRA-TION OF ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS.—In providing assist-19 20 ance under this section, the Secretary shall give priority 21 to State and county veteran agencies in locations—

"(1) that have relatively large concentrations of
populations of veterans and other individuals referred to in subsection (a); or

"(2) that are experiencing growth in the popu lation of veterans and other individuals referred to
 in subsection (a).

"(c) CONTRACTS FOR OUTREACH SERVICES.—The 4 5 Secretary may enter into a contract with a State or county veterans agency in order to carry out, coordinate, improve, 6 7 or otherwise enhance outreach by the Department and the 8 State or county (including outreach with respect to a State 9 or county veterans program). As a condition of entering 10 into any such contract, the Secretary shall require the agency to submit annually to the Secretary a three-year 11 12 plan for the use of any funds provided to the agency pur-13 suant to the contract and to meet the annual outcome measures developed by the Secretary under subsection 14 15 (d)(4).

16 "(d) GRANTS.—(1) The Secretary may make a grant
17 to a State or county veterans agency to be used to carry
18 out, coordinate, improve, or otherwise enhance—

"(A) outreach activities, including activities carried out pursuant to a contract entered into under
subsection (c); and

"(B) activities to assist in the development and
submittal of claims for veterans and veterans-related
benefits, including activities carried out pursuant to
a contract entered into under subsection (c).

1 "(2) A State veterans agency that receives a grant 2 under this subsection may award all or a portion of the 3 grant to county veterans agencies within the State to pro-4 vide outreach services for veterans, on the basis of the 5 number of veterans residing in the jurisdiction of each 6 county.

7 "(3) To be eligible for a grant under this subsection,
8 a State or county veterans agency shall submit to the Sec9 retary an application containing such information and as10 surances as the Secretary may require. The Secretary
11 shall require a State or county veterans agency to include,
12 as part of the agency's application—

13 "(A) a three-year plan for the use of the grant;14 and

"(B) a description of the programs through
which the agency will meet the annual outcome
measures developed by the Secretary under paragraph (4).

"(4)(A) The Secretary shall develop and provide to
the recipient of a grant under this subsection written guidance on annual outcome measures, Department policies,
and procedures for applying for grants under this section.
"(B) The Secretary shall annually review the performance of each State or county veterans agency that re-

25 ceives a grant under this section.

1 "(C) In the case of a State or county veterans agency 2 that is a recipient of a grant under this subsection that 3 does not meet the annual outcome measures developed by 4 the Secretary, the Secretary shall require the agency to 5 submit a remediation plan under which the agency shall describe how and when it plans to meet such outcome 6 7 measures. The Secretary must approve such plan before 8 the Secretary may make a subsequent grant to that agen-9 cy under this subsection.

10 "(5) No portion of any grant awarded under this sub-11 section may be used for the purposes of administering the 12 grant funds or to subsidize the salaries of State or county 13 veterans service officers or other employees of a State or 14 county veterans agency that receives a grant under this 15 subsection.

16 "(6) Federal funds provided to a State or county vet-17 erans agency under this subsection may not be used to 18 provide more than 50 percent of the total cost of the State 19 or county government activities described in paragraph (1) 20 and shall be used to expand existing outreach programs 21 and services and not to supplant State and local funding 22 that is otherwise available.

23 "(7) In awarding grants under this subsection, the
24 Secretary shall give priority to State and county veterans
25 agencies that serve the largest populations of veterans.

"(8)(A) In a case in which a county government does
 not have a county veterans agency, the county government
 may be awarded a grant under this subsection to establish
 such an agency.

5 "(B) In a case in which a county government does 6 not have a county veterans agency and does not seek to 7 establish such an agency through the use of a grant under 8 this subsection, the State veterans agency for the State 9 in which the county is located may use a grant under this 10 section to provide outreach services for that county.

11 "(C) In the case of a State in which no State or coun-12 ty veterans agency seeks to receive a grant under this sub-13 section, the funds that would otherwise be allocated for 14 that State shall be reallocated to those States in which 15 county veterans agencies exist and have sought grants 16 under this subsection.

17 "(9) A grant under this subsection may be used to provide education and training, including on-the-job train-18 19 ing, for State, county, and local government employees 20 who provide (or when trained will provide) veterans out-21 reach services in order for those employees to obtain ac-22 creditation in accordance with procedures approved by the 23 Secretary and, for employees so accredited, for purposes 24 of continuing education.

25 "(e) DEFINITIONS.—For the purposes of this section:

"(1) The term 'State veterans agency' means
 the element of the government of a State that has
 responsibility for programs and activities of that
 State government relating to veterans benefits.

5 "(2) The term 'county veterans agency' means 6 the element of the government of a county or mu-7 nicipality that has responsibility for programs and 8 activities of that county or municipal government re-9 lating to veterans benefits.

10 "§ 563. Outreach activities: funding

"(a) SEPARATE ACCOUNT.—Amounts for the outreach activities of the Department under this subchapter
shall be budgeted and appropriated through a separate appropriation account.

15 "(b) SEPARATE STATEMENT OF AMOUNT.—In the 16 budget justification materials submitted to Congress in 17 support of the Department budget for any fiscal year (as 18 submitted with the budget of the President under section 19 1105(a) of title 31), the Secretary shall include a separate 20 statement of the amount requested to be appropriated for 21 that fiscal year for the account specified in subsection (a).

22 "§ 564. Definition of outreach

23 "For purposes of this subchapter, the term 'outreach'
24 means the act or process of taking steps in a systematic
25 manner to provide information, services, and benefits

counseling to veterans, and the survivors of veterans, who
 may be eligible to receive benefits under the laws adminis tered by the Secretary to ensure that those individuals are
 fully informed about, and assisted in applying for, any
 benefits and programs under such laws for which they may
 be eligible.

7 "§ 565. Authorization of appropriations

8 "There is authorized to be appropriated to the Sec9 retary for each of fiscal years 2008, 2009, and 2010,
10 \$25,000,000 to carry out this subchapter, including mak11 ing grants under section 562(d) of this title.".

(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
at the beginning of such chapter is amended by adding
at the end the following new items:
