Ms. Clarke introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Financial Services

A BILL

- To improve inspections of public housing and federally assisted multifamily housing conducted by the Real Estate Assessment Center of the Department of Housing and Urban Development.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Real Estate Assess-
 - 5 ment Center Inspection Improvement Act of 2008".
 - 6 SEC. 2. IMPROVEMENT OF INSPECTIONS.
 - 7 The Secretary of Housing and Urban Development,
 - 8 in consultation with public housing agencies and owners

- 1 of federally assisted multifamily housing, shall take such
- 2 actions as may be necessary to improve the activities of
- 3 the Real Estate Assessment Center of the Department of
- 4 Housing and Urban Development for physical assessment
- 5 and inspection of public housing and federally assisted
- 6 multifamily housing, including developing a detailed proc-
- 7 ess to improve planning and preparation for inspections
- 8 of such housing, as follows:
- 9 (1) ADVANCE NOTICE OF OFFLINE UNITS.—The 10 Secretary shall require, and provide for, public hous-11 ing agencies and owners of federally assisted multi-12 family housing to inform the Real Estate Assess-13 ment Center an adequate period of time in advance 14 of an inspection regarding any dwelling units that 15 will be offline during the inspection due to unit re-16 pairs, rehabilitation, or damage due to natural disas-17 ters.
 - (2) Scheduling inspections.—The Secretary shall require the Real Estate Assessment Center, in scheduling inspections of public housing and federally assisted multifamily housing—
- 22 (A) to consult with the public housing 23 agency or owner of the housing, as applicable, 24 to determine a mutually agreeable date for the

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1	inspection that is consistent with the schedule
2	of the agency or owner; and
3	(B) in the case of public housing agencies
4	designated pursuant to section 6(j) of the
5	United States Housing Act of 1937 (42 U.S.C.
6	1437d(j)) as high-performing agencies, to
7	schedule regular inspections every three years.
8	(3) Selection of inspectors.—The Sec-
9	retary shall provide that a Real Estate Assessment
10	Center inspection of public housing or federally as-
11	sisted multifamily housing shall be conducted by an
12	inspector who is selected by the public housing agen-
13	cy or owner of the housing, as applicable, from a list
14	of qualified, participating inspectors developed and
15	provided by the Secretary.
16	(4) Inspections.—The Secretary shall provide
17	that in carrying out any inspection and assessment
18	of public housing or federally assisted multifamily
19	housing, the Real Estate Assessment Center shall—
20	(A) identify, but not score deficiencies on
21	items not owned or controlled by the public
22	housing agency, including neighbors' fences,
23	tenants' extra appliances, and municipal side-
24	walks and streets; and
25	(B) require that—

1	(i) any assessment shall factor the im-
2	pact, with respect to a public housing
3	agency, of any chronic under-funding of
4	the Public Housing Operating Fund and
5	the Public Housing Capital Fund and any
6	detrimental effects that successive years of
7	under-funding have had the agency's abil-
8	ity to adequately maintain the physical
9	condition of public housing; and
10	(ii) any final Real Estate Assessment

- (ii) any final Real Estate Assessment Center score is prorated to reflects such under-funding.
- (5) RE-INSPECTIONS.—The Secretary shall provide that any public housing agency having a property that fails a Real Estate Assessment Center physical inspection may request a re-inspection so that deficiencies can be cured before establishment of a final Real Estate Assessment Center score.
- (6) Training.—The Secretary shall make the three-day Real Estate Assessment Center physical inspection training for non-inspectors, held in Washington, DC, available to personnel of all public housing agencies throughout the Nation, by use of the World Wide Web or other electronic means.

1 (7) Advisory committee.—The Secretary 2 shall convene an advisory committee (within the 3 meaning given such term in the Federal Advisory 4 Committee Act (5 U.S.C. App.) to review and make 5 recommendations for revising, as necessary, the Real 6 Estate Assessment Center scoring system.

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
