## AN ACT

To extend the waiver authority for the Secretary of Education under section 105 of subtitle A of title IV of division B of Public Law 109–148, relating to elementary and secondary education hurricane recovery relief, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF WAIVER AUTHORITY TO EASE**  
2 **FISCAL BURDENS.**

3 Section 105 of subtitle A of title IV of division B of  
4 Public Law 109–148 (119 Stat. 2797) is amended—

5 (1) in the second sentence of subsection (b), by  
6 striking “2008” and inserting “2009”; and

7 (2) in subsection (c)(2), by striking “for fiscal  
8 year 2006 or 2007” and inserting “for any fiscal  
9 year”.

10 **SEC. 2. HOLD HARMLESS FOR LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGEN-**  
11 **CIES SERVING MAJOR DISASTER AREAS.**

12 In the case of a local educational agency that serves  
13 an area in which the President has declared that a major  
14 disaster exists in accordance with section 401 of the Rob-  
15 ert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance  
16 Act (42 U.S.C. 5170), related to severe storms, tornadoes,  
17 or flooding in the Midwest or hurricanes in the Gulf of  
18 Mexico in calendar year 2008, the amount made available  
19 for such local educational agency under each of sections  
20 1124, 1124A, 1125, and 1125A of the Elementary and  
21 Secondary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 6333, 6334,  
22 6335, and 6337) for fiscal year 2009 shall be not less than

1 the amount made available for such local educational  
2 agency under each of such sections for fiscal year 2008.
