Mr. Ryan of Ohio (for himself, Mr. Israel, Mr. Weiner, Mr. Rodriguez, Ms. Shea-Porter, and Mrs. Boyda of Kansas) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Education and Labor

A BILL

To establish a Public Service Scholarship Program, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Public Service Scholar-
- 5 ship Act of 2008".
- 6 SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF PUBLIC SERVICE SCHOLAR-
- 7 SHIP PROGRAM.
- 8 Part A of title IV of the Higher Education Act of
- 9 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1070 et seq.) is amended by adding at
- 10 the end the following new subpart:

1 "Subpart 10—Public Service Scholarship Program

- 2 "SEC. 420Q. SCHOLARSHIPS FOR PUBLIC SERVICE.
- 3 "(a) STATEMENT OF PURPOSE.—It is the purpose of
- 4 this subpart to establish a Public Service Scholarship Pro-
- 5 gram to promote public service by exceptionally able stu-
- 6 dents who show promise of continued excellence.
- 7 "(b) Scholarships Authorized.—
- 8 "(1) Program Authority.—The Secretary is 9 authorized, in accordance with the provisions of this 10 subpart, to make grants to States to enable the 11 States to award scholarships to individuals who have 12 demonstrated outstanding academic achievement, 13 who show promise of continued academic achieve-14 ment, and who enter into an agreement in accord-15 ance with subsection (e)(3).
 - "(2) Period of Award.—Scholarships under this section shall be awarded for a period of not less than 1 or more than 4 years during the first 4 years of study at any institution of higher education eligible to participate in any programs assisted under this title. The State educational agency administering the program in a State shall have discretion to determine the period of the award (within the limits specified in the preceding sentence).

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- 1 "(3) USE AT ANY INSTITUTION PERMITTED.—
 2 A student awarded a scholarship under this subpart
 3 may attend any institution of higher education.
 - "(4) Public Service Scholars.—Individuals awarded scholarships under this subpart shall be known as 'Public Service Scholars'.

"(c) Allocation Among States.—

- "(1) Allocation formula.—From the sums appropriated pursuant to subsection (i) for any fiscal year, the Secretary shall allocate to each State that has an agreement under subsection (d) an amount equal to \$10,000 multiplied by the number of scholarships determined by the Secretary to be available to such State in accordance with paragraph (2).
- "(2) Number of scholarships to be made available in a State for any fiscal year shall bear the same ratio to the number of scholarships made available to all States as the State's population ages 5 through 17 bears to the population ages 5 through 17 in all the States, except that not less than 10 scholarships shall be made available to any State.
- "(3) USE OF CENSUS DATA.—For the purpose of this subsection, the population ages 5 through 17

- 1 in a State and in all the States shall be determined
- 2 by the most recently available data, satisfactory to
- 3 the Secretary, from the Bureau of the Census.
- 4 "(d) AGREEMENTS WITH STATES.—The Secretary
- 5 shall enter into an agreement with each State desiring to
- 6 participate in the scholarship program authorized by this
- 7 subpart. Each such agreement shall include provisions de-
- 8 signed to assure that—
- 9 "(1) the State educational agency will admin-
- ister the scholarship program authorized by this sub-
- 11 part in the State;
- 12 "(2) the State educational agency will comply
- with the eligibility and selection provisions of this
- subpart;
- 15 "(3) the State educational agency will conduct
- outreach activities to publicize the availability of
- scholarships under this subpart to all eligible stu-
- dents in the State, with particular emphasis on ac-
- tivities designed to assure that students from low-in-
- 20 come and moderate-income families have access to
- 21 the information on the opportunity for full participa-
- 22 tion in the scholarship program authorized by this
- subpart; and
- 24 "(4) the State educational agency will pay to
- each individual in the State who is awarded a schol-

1	arship for any academic year under this subpart
2	\$10,000 for such academic year.
3	"(e) Eligibility of Scholars.—
4	"(1) High school graduation or equiva-
5	LENT AND ADMISSION TO INSTITUTION RE-
6	QUIRED.—Each student awarded a scholarship
7	under this subpart shall—
8	"(A) be a graduate of a public or private
9	secondary school (or a home school, whether
10	treated as a home school or a private school
11	under State law) or have the equivalent of a
12	certificate of graduation as recognized by the
13	State in which the student resides; and
14	"(B) have been admitted for enrollment at
15	an institution of higher education.
16	"(2) Selection based on promise of aca-
17	DEMIC ACHIEVEMENT.—Each student awarded a
18	scholarship under this subpart must demonstrate
19	outstanding academic achievement and show promise
20	of continued academic achievement.
21	"(3) Public service agreements.—
22	"(A) In general.—To be eligible to re-
23	ceive a scholarship under this subpart, a stu-
24	dent shall enter into a written agreement with
25	the Secretary that specifies that—

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1	"(i) the student will seek to obtain
2	employment, and will remain employed, as
3	an employee of the Federal Government
4	for a required period of service of not less
5	than 5 years, unless the student fails to
6	obtain or is involuntarily separated from
7	that employment;
8	"(ii) if the student fails to obtain such
9	employment, or is involuntarily separated
10	from such employment on account of mis-
11	conduct, or voluntarily separates from such
12	employment, before the end of the period
13	specified in the agreement, the student will
14	repay the Secretary the sum of the
15	amounts of any scholarships received by
16	such student under this subpart;
17	"(iii) if the student is required to
18	repay an amount to the Secretary under
19	clause (ii) and fails to repay such amount,
20	a sum equal to that amount shall be recov-
21	erable by the Federal Government from
22	the student by such methods as are pro-

vided by law for the recovery of amounts

owed to the Federal Government; and

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1	"(iv) the Secretary may waive, in
2	whole or in part, a right of recovery under
3	this subsection if the individual is perma-
4	nently and totally disabled at the time of
5	the waiver request or the Secretary deter-
6	mines, on the basis of a demonstration
7	submitted by or on behalf of the individual,
8	that—
9	"(I) recovery would cause the in-
10	dividual a substantial economic or
11	personal hardship; or
12	"(II) recovery would be otherwise
13	contrary to the public interest;
14	"(B) Repayments.—
15	"(i) In general.—Any amount re-
16	paid by, or recovered from, an individual
17	under this paragraph shall be credited to
18	the appropriation account from which the
19	amount involved was originally paid as a
20	scholarship.
21	"(ii) Merger.—Any amount credited
22	under clause (i) shall be merged with other
23	sums in such account and shall be avail-
24	able for the same purposes and period, and
25	subject to the same limitations, if any, as

1	the sums with which the amount was
2	merged.
3	"(f) Selection of Scholars.—
4	"(1) ESTABLISHMENT OF CRITERIA.—The
5	State educational agency is authorized to establish
6	the criteria for the selection of scholars under this
7	subpart.
8	"(2) Adoption of Procedures.—The State
9	educational agency shall adopt selection procedures
10	designed to ensure an equitable geographic distribu-
11	tion of awards within the State (and in the case of
12	the Guam, the Virgin Islands, American Samoa, the
13	Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, or
14	the Freely Associated States, not to exceed 10 indi-
15	viduals will be selected from such entities).
16	"(3) Consultation requirement.—In car-
17	rying out its responsibilities under paragraphs (1)
18	and (2), the State educational agency shall consult
19	with school administrators, school boards, teachers,
20	counselors, and parents.
21	"(4) Timing of Selection.—The selection
22	process shall be completed, and the awards made,
23	prior to the end of each secondary school academic
24	year.
25	"(g) STIPENDS AND SCHOLARSHIP CONDITIONS.—

- 1 "(1) Amount of award.—Each student 2 awarded a scholarship under this subpart shall re-3 ceive a stipend of \$10,000 for each academic year of 4 study for which the scholarship is awarded, except 5 that in no case shall—
 - "(A) the total amount of financial aid awarded to such student exceed such student's total cost-of-attendance for any such academic year; or
 - "(B) the total amount of financial aid awarded to such student under this subpart exceed a total of \$40,000 for all such academic years.
- "(2) USE OF AWARD.—The State educational agency shall establish procedures to assure that a scholar awarded a scholarship under this subpart pursues a course of study at an institution of higher education.
- "(h) Construction of Needs Provisions.—Ex20 cept as provided in section 471, nothing in this subpart,
 21 or any other Act, shall be construed to permit the receipt
 22 of a scholarship under this subpart to be counted for any
 23 needs test in connection with the awarding of any grant
 24 or the making of any loan under this Act or any other
 25 provision of Federal law relating to educational assistance.

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- 1 "(i) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
- 2 are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this subpart
- 3 for fiscal year 2009 and each of the 3 succeeding fiscal
- 4 years such sums as may be necessary to award 10,000
- 5 Public Service Scholarships during each of the academic
- 6 years that begin in such fiscal years.".

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
