A BILL

To limit United States assistance for infrastructure projects in Iraq, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 SECTION 1. FINDINGS.
- 4 Congress finds the following:
- 5 (1) The Government Accountability Office in its
- 6 August 2008 report entitled "Iraqi Revenue, Ex-
- 7 penditures, and Surplus," found that from 2005 to
- 8 2007 "[the Iraqi] government generated an esti-
- 9 mated \$96 billion in cumulative revenues, of which

1	crude oil export sales accounted for about \$90.2 bil-
2	lion, or 94 percent".
3	(2) That same report found that for 2008 the
4	Iraqi Government could have a budget surplus of
5	more than \$50 billion.
6	(3) Iraq has the world's third largest oil re-
7	serve, providing a steady stream of revenue.
8	(4) According to the Government Accountability
9	Office, since fiscal year 2003, the United States has
10	provided \$48 billion for stabilization and reconstruc-
11	tion efforts in Iraq.
12	SEC. 2. LIMITATION ON UNITED STATES ASSISTANCE FOR
13	INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS IN IRAQ.
14	(a) Limitation.—Except as provided in subsection
15	(b), no funds may be obligated or expended for the acquisi-
16	tion, conversion, rehabilitation, or installation of facilities
17	in Iraq that is commenced on or after the date of the en-
18	actment of this Act.

- 6 to Congress a report describing the status of negotiations
- 7 required under subsection (a).
