# In the House of Representatives, U. S.,

Resolved, That the House agree to the amendment of the Senate to the bill (H.R. 710) entitled "An Act to amend the National Organ Transplant Act to provide that criminal penalties do not apply to paired donations of human kidneys, and for other purposes", with the following

## HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE AMENDMENT:

In lieu of the matter proposed to be inserted by the amendment of the Senate to the text of the bill, insert the following:

### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "Charlie W. Norwood
- 3 Living Organ Donation Act".
- 4 SEC. 2. AMENDMENTS TO THE NATIONAL ORGAN TRANS-
- 5 **PLANT ACT.**
- 6 Section 301 of the National Organ Transplant Act (42
- 7 U.S.C. 274e) is amended—
- 8 (1) in subsection (a), by adding at the end the
- 9 following: "The preceding sentence does not apply
- 10 with respect to human organ paired donation."; and
- 11 (2) in subsection (c), by adding at the end the
- 12 following:

1	"(4) The term 'human organ paired donation				
2	means the donation and receipt of human organs				
3	under the following circumstances:				
4	"(A) An individual (referred to in this				
5	paragraph as the 'first donor') desires to make of				
6	living donation of a human organ specifically to				
7	a particular patient (referred to in this para				
8	graph as the 'first patient'), but such donor i				
9	biologically incompatible as a donor for such pa				
10	tient.				
11	"(B) A second individual (referred to in				
12	this paragraph as the 'second donor') desires to				
13	make a living donation of a human organ spe				
14	cifically to a second particular patient (referre				
15	to in this paragraph as the 'second patient'), but				
16	such donor is biologically incompatible as				
17	donor for such patient.				
18	"(C) Subject to subparagraph (D), the first				
19	donor is biologically compatible as a donor of a				
20	human organ for the second patient, and the sec-				
21	ond donor is biologically compatible as a donor				
22	of a human organ for the first patient.				
23	"(D) If there is any additional donor-pa-				
24	tient pair as described in subparagraph (A) or				

(B), each donor in the group of donor-patient

pairs is biologically compatible as a donor of a
 human organ for a patient in such group.

"(E) All donors and patients in the group of donor-patient pairs (whether 2 pairs or more than 2 pairs) enter into a single agreement to donate and receive such human organs, respectively, according to such biological compatibility in the group.

"(F) Other than as described in subparagraph (E), no valuable consideration is knowingly acquired, received, or otherwise transferred with respect to the human organs referred to in such subparagraph.".

### 14 **SEC. 3. REPORT.**

Not later than 1 year after the date of enactment of this Act, and annually thereafter, the Secretary of Health and Human Services shall submit to the appropriate committees of Congress a report that details the progress made towards understanding the long-term health effects of living organ donation.

### 21 SEC. 4. NO IMPACT ON SOCIAL SECURITY TRUST FUND.

Nothing in this Act (or an amendment made by this 23 Act) shall be construed to alter or amend the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 301 et seq.) (or any regulation promulgated under that Act). Amend the title so as to read: "An Act to amend the National Organ Transplant Act to provide that criminal penalties do not apply to human organ paired donation, and for other purposes.".
