A BILL

To provide all low-income students with the same opportunity to receive a Pell Grant by eliminating the tuition sensitivity provision in the Pell Grant program.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Pell Grant Equity Act
5 of 2007”.

6 **SEC. 2. TUITION SENSITIVITY.**

7 (a) AMENDMENT.—Section 401(b) of the Higher
8 Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1070a(b)) is amend-
9 ed—

1 (1) by striking paragraph (3); and

2 (2) by redesignating paragraphs (4) through

3 (8) as paragraphs (3) through (7), respectively.

4 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by

5 subsection (a) shall be effective for any academic year be-

6 ginning on or after July 1, 2007.
