**AN ACT**

To amend Public Law 106–348 to extend the authorization  
for establishing a memorial in the District of Columbia  
or its environs to honor veterans who became disabled  
while serving in the Armed Forces of the United States.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF AUTHORITY FOR ESTABLISHING**  
4               **DISABLED VETERANS MEMORIAL.**

5       Public Law 106–348 is amended—

6               (1) in subsection (b)—

1 (A) by striking “The establishment” and  
2 inserting “Except as provided in subsection (e),  
3 the establishment”; and

4 (B) by striking “the Commemorative  
5 Works Act (40 U.S.C. 1001 et seq.)” and in-  
6 serting “chapter 89 of title 40, United States  
7 Code”;

8 (2) in subsection (d)—

9 (A) by striking “section 8(b) of the Com-  
10 memorative Works Act (40 U.S.C. 1008(b))”  
11 and inserting “section 8906 of title 40, United  
12 States Code”;

13 (B) by striking “or upon expiration of the  
14 authority for the memorial under section 10(b)  
15 of such Act (40 U.S.C. 1010(b)),”; and

16 (C) by striking “section 8(b)(1) of such  
17 Act (40 U.S.C. 1008(b)(1))” and inserting  
18 “8906(b)(2) or (3) of such title”; and

19 (3) by adding at the end the following new sub-  
20 section:

21 “(e) TERMINATION OF AUTHORITY.—Notwith-  
22 standing section 8903(e) of title 40, United States Code,  
23 the authority to establish a memorial under this section  
24 shall expire on October 24, 2015.”.
