RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the Senate amendments to the bill (H.R. 3221) moving the United States toward greater energy independence and security, developing innovative new technologies, reducing carbon emissions, creating green jobs, protecting consumers, increasing clean renewable energy production, and modernizing our energy infrastructure, and to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide tax incentives for the production of renewable energy and energy conservation.

1 *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it
2 shall be in order to take from the Speaker's table the bill
3 (H.R. 3221) moving the United States toward greater en-
4 ergy independence and security, developing innovative new
5 technologies, reducing carbon emissions, creating green
6 jobs, protecting consumers, increasing clean renewable en-
7 ergy production, and modernizing our energy infrastruc-
8 ture, and to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986
9 to provide tax incentives for the production of renewable
10 energy and energy conservation, with the Senate amend-
11 ments thereto, and to consider in the House, without
12 intervention of any point of order except those arising
13 under clause 10 of rule XXI, a motion offered by the
14 chairman of the Committee on Financial Services or his
15 designee that the House concur in the Senate amendment
16 to the text with each of the three amendments printed in
17 the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this
18 resolution. The Senate amendments and the motion shall
19 be considered as read. The motion shall be debatable for
20 three hours, with two hours equally divided and controlled
21 by the chairman and ranking minority member of the
22 Committee on Financial Services and one hour equally di-
23 vided and controlled by the chairman and ranking minor-
24 ity member of the Committee on Ways and Means. The
25 previous question shall be considered as ordered on the

1 motion to its adoption without intervening motion except
2 that the Chair shall divide the question among each of
3 the three House amendments.

4 SEC. 2. Upon adoption of the motion specified in the
5 first section of this resolution, a motion that the House
6 concur in the Senate amendment to the title shall be con-
7 sidered as adopted.

8 SEC. 3. During consideration of the motion to concur
9 pursuant to this resolution, notwithstanding the operation
10 of the previous question, the Chair may postpone further
11 consideration of the motion to such time as may be des-
12 ignated by the Speaker.
