## A BILL

To provide for the reinstatement of a license for a certain  
Federal Energy Regulatory Commission project.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REINSTATEMENT OF LICENSE FOR FEDERAL**  
4 **ENERGY REGULATORY COMMISSION**  
5 **PROJECT.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding the time period  
7 specified in section 13 of the Federal Power Act (16  
8 U.S.C. 806) that would otherwise apply to the project  
9 numbered 7307 of the Federal Energy Regulatory Com-  
10 mission, the Commission shall, on the request of the li-

1 censee for the project, in accordance with that section (in-  
 2 cluding the good faith, due diligence, and public interest  
 3 requirements of that section and procedures established  
 4 under that section), extend the time required for com-  
 5 mencement of construction of the project until 24 months  
 6 after the date of enactment of this Act.

7 (b) APPLICABILITY.—Subsection (a) shall apply to  
 8 the project on the expiration of any extension, issued by  
 9 the Commission under section 13 of the Federal Power  
 10 Act (16 U.S.C. 806), of the time required for commence-  
 11 ment of construction of the project.

12 (c) REINSTATEMENT OF TERMINATED LICENSE.—If  
 13 a license of the Commission for the project has been termi-  
 14 nated before the date of enactment of this Act, the Com-  
 15 mission shall—

16 (1) reinstate the license effective as of the date  
 17 of the termination of the license; and

18 (2) extend the time required for commencement  
 19 of construction of the project until 24 months after  
 20 the date of enactment of this Act.
