A BILL

To amend the Public Health Service Act to modify the program for the sanctuary system for surplus chimpanzees by terminating the authority for the removal of chimpanzees from the system for research purposes.

3 **SECTION 1. SANCTUARY SYSTEM FOR SURPLUS CHIM-**
4 **PANZEES; TERMINATION OF AUTHORITY FOR**
5 **REMOVAL FROM SYSTEM FOR RESEARCH**
6 **PURPOSES.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—The first section 481C of the
8 Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 287a–3a) (added by

1 section 2 of Public Law 106–551) is amended in sub-
2 section (d)—

3 (1) in paragraph (2), in subparagraph (J), by
4 striking “If any chimpanzee is removed” and all that
5 follows; and

6 (2) in paragraph (3)—

7 (A) in subparagraph (A)—

8 (i) by striking clause (ii); and

9 (ii) by striking “except as provided”
10 in the matter preceding clause (i) and all
11 that follows through “behavioral studies”
12 and inserting the following: “except that
13 the chimpanzee may be used for
14 noninvasive behavioral studies”;

15 (B) by striking subparagraph (B);

16 (C) by redesignating subparagraph (C) as
17 subparagraph (B); and

18 (D) in subparagraph (B) (as so redesign-
19 ated), by striking “under subparagraphs (A)
20 and (B)” and inserting “under subparagraph
21 (A)”.

22 (b) TECHNICAL CORRECTION.—Part E of title IV of
23 the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 287 et seq.) is
24 amended by redesignating the second section 481C (added

1 by section 204(a) of Public Law 106–505) as section
2 481D.
