3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Wolf House Study Act5 of 2007".

1 SEC. 2. FINDING.

2 Congress finds that the Wolf House, located in Nor-3 folk, Arkansas, is the oldest 2-story log structure and the 4 oldest territorial courthouse west of the Mississippi River. 5 **SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.** In this Act: 6 (1) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means 7 8 the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Di-9 rector of the National Park Service. (2) WOLF HOUSE.—The term "Wolf House" 10 11 means the structure known by that name located on 12 Highway 5 in Norfolk, Arkansas. 13 SEC. 4. WOLF HOUSE STUDY. 14 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary, in consultation 15 with the State of Arkansas, shall— 16 (1) carry out a study on the suitability and fea-17 sibility of designating the Wolf House as a unit of 18 the National Park System; and 19 (2) consider management alternatives for the 20 Wolf House. 21 (b) APPLICABLE LAW.—Except as provided by sub-22 section (c), section 8(c) of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 23 1a-5(c)) shall apply to the conduct and completion of the 24 study required by subsection (a). 25 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 1 year after the date 26 of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit to

the Committee on Natural Resources of the House of Rep resentatives and the Committee on Energy and Natural
Resources of the Senate a report describing the results
of the study.
