### AN ACT

- To modify the boundaries of Grand Teton National Park to include certain land within the GT Park Subdivision, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Grand Teton National

5 Park Extension Act of 2007".

#### 1 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.

2 In this Act:

(1) PARK.—The term "Park" means the Grand 3 4 Teton National Park. (2) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means 5 6 the Secretary of the Interior. SUBDIVISION.—The term "Subdivision" 7 (3)means the GT Park Subdivision, with an area of ap-8 9 proximately 49.67 acres, as generally depicted on— 10 (A) the plat recorded in the Office of the 11 Teton County Clerk and Recorder on December 12 16, 1997, numbered 918, entitled "Final Plat 13 GT Park Subdivision", and dated June 18, 14 1997; and (B) the map entitled "2006 Proposed 15

15 (B) the map entitled 2000 Proposed 16 Grand Teton Boundary Adjustment", numbered 17 136/80,198, and dated March 21, 2006, which 18 shall be on file and available for inspection in 19 appropriate offices of the National Park Serv-20 ice.

#### 21 SEC. 3. ACQUISITION OF LAND.

(a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may accept from
any willing donor the donation of any land or interest in
land of the Subdivision.

(b) ADMINISTRATION.—On acquisition of land or an
interest in land under subsection (a), the Secretary shall—

6	(c) DEADLINE FOR ACQUISITION.—It is the intent of
7	Congress that the acquisition of land or an interest in land
8	under subsection (a) be completed not later than 1 year
9	after the date of enactment of this Act.
10	(d) RESTRICTION ON TRANSFER.—The Secretary
11	shall not donate, sell, exchange, or otherwise transfer any
12	land acquired under this section without express author-
13	ization from Congress.

 Representatives, Craig Thomas forged a distin guished legislative record on issues as diverse as
 public land management, agriculture, fiscal responsi bility, and rural health care;

7 (3) as Chairman and Ranking Member of the 8 National Parks Subcommittee of the Committee on 9 Energy and Natural Resources of the Senate and a 10 frequent visitor to many units of the National Park 11 System, including Yellowstone National Park and 12 Grand Teton National Park, Craig Thomas was a 13 strong proponent for ensuring that people of all ages 14 and abilities had a wide range of opportunities to 15 learn more about the natural and cultural heritage 16 of the United States;

(4) Craig Thomas authored legislation to provide critical funding and management reforms to
protect units of the National Park System into the
21 21st century, ensuring quality visits to units of the
National Park System and the protection of natural
and cultural resources;

(5) Craig Thomas strongly supported publicprivate partnerships and collaboration between the
National Park Service and other organizations that

1	foster new opportunities for providing visitor services
2	while encouraging greater citizen involvement in the
3	stewardship of units of the National Park System;
4	(6) Craig Thomas was instrumental in obtain-
5	ing the Federal share for a public-private partner-
6	ship with the Grand Teton National Park Founda-
7	tion and the Grand Teton Natural History Associa-
8	tion to construct a new discovery and visitor center
9	at Grand Teton National Park;
10	(7) on June 4, 2007, Craig Thomas passed
11	away after battling cancer for 7 months;
12	(8) Craig Thomas is survived by his wife,
13	Susan, and children, Patrick, Greg, Peter, and
14	Lexie; and
15	(9) in memory of the distinguished career of
16	service of Craig Thomas to the people of the United
17	States, the dedication of Craig Thomas to units of
18	the National Park System, generally, and to Grand
19	Teton National Park, specifically, and the critical
20	role of Craig Thomas in the new discovery and vis-
21	itor center at Grand Teton National Park, the
22	Grand Teton Discovery and Visitor Center should be
23	designated as the "Craig Thomas Discovery and Vis-
24	itor Center".

(b) The Craig Thomas Discovery and Visitor
 Center.—

3 (1) DESIGNATION.—The Grand Teton Dis4 covery and Visitor Center located in Moose, Wyo5 ming, and scheduled for completion in August 2007
6 shall be known and designated as the "Craig Thom7 as Discovery and Visitor Center".

8 (2) REFERENCE.—Any reference in a law, map, 9 regulation, document, paper, or other record of the 10 United States to the Grand Teton Discovery and 11 Visitor Center referred to in paragraph (1) shall be 12 deemed to be a reference to the "Craig Thomas Dis-13 covery and Visitor Center".

#### 14 SEC. 5. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

15 There are authorized to be appropriated to the Sec16 retary such sums as are necessary to carry out this Act.
