Mr. CORNYN introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources

A BILL

To amend the Palo Alto Battlefield National Historic Site Act of 1991 to expand the boundaries of the historic site, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Palo Alto Battlefield
5 National Historic Site Boundary Expansion Act of 2008”.

6 **SEC. 2. BOUNDARY EXPANSION, PALO ALTO BATTLEFIELD**
7 **NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE, TEXAS.**

8 Section 3(b) of the Palo Alto Battlefield National
9 Historic Site Act of 1991 (16 U.S.C. 461 note; Public Law
10 102–304) is amended—

1 (1) in paragraph (1), by striking “(1) The his-
 2 toric site” and inserting the following:

3 “(1) IN GENERAL.—The historic site”;

4 (2) by redesignating paragraph (2) as para-
 5 graph (3);

6 (3) by inserting after paragraph (1) the fol-
 7 lowing:

8 “(2) ADDITIONAL LAND.—

9 “(A) IN GENERAL.—In addition to the
 10 land described in paragraph (1), the historic
 11 site shall consist of approximately 34 acres of
 12 land, as generally depicted on the map entitled
 13 ‘ _____’, numbered _____, and dated
 14 _____.

15 “(B) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—The map
 16 described in subparagraph (A) shall be on file
 17 and available for public inspection in the appro-
 18 priate offices of the National Park Service.”;

19 and

20 (4) in paragraph (3) (as redesignated by para-
 21 graph (2))—

22 (A) by striking “(3) Within” and inserting
 23 the following:

24 “(3) LEGAL DESCRIPTION.—Not later than”;

25 and

1 (B) in the second sentence, by striking
2 “map referred to in paragraph (1)” and insert-
3 ing “maps referred to in paragraphs (1) and
4 (2)”.
