A BILL

To modify the age-60 standard for certain pilots and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Freedom to Fly Act5 of 2007".

6 SEC. 2. MODIFICATION OF FAA'S AGE-60 STANDARD.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—A pilot who has attained 60 years
8 of age may serve as a pilot of an aircraft operated by an
9 air carrier engaged in operations under part 121 of title

1 14, Code of Federal Regulations, until attaining 65 years
 2 of age only if the pilot serves—

3 (1) as a required pilot in multi-crew aircraft op-4 erations; and

5 (2) with another pilot serving as a required
6 pilot in such multi-crew aircraft operations who has
7 not yet attained 60 years of age.

8 (b) SUNSET OF AGE-60 RULE.—

9 (1) IN GENERAL.—On and after the effective
10 date described in subsection (e), section 121.383(c)
11 of title 14, Code of Federal Regulations shall have
12 no further force or effect.

(2) REGULATIONS.—Not later than 30 days
after the effective date described in subsection (e),
the Secretary of Transportation shall take such action as may be necessary to implement paragraph
(1) and to modify the regulations relating to pilot
privileges by reason of age.

(c) APPLICABILITY.—The provisions of subsection (a)
shall not provide a basis for a claim of seniority under
any labor agreement in effect between a recognized bargaining unit for pilots and an air carrier engaged in operations under part 121 of title 14, Code of Federal Regulations, that is made by a person who was a pilot and who
attained 60 years of age before the effective date described

1 in subsection (e) and is seeking a position as a pilot with
2 such air carrier following that person's termination or ces3 sation of employment or promotion or transfer to another
4 position with such air carrier pursuant to section
5 121.383(c) of title 14, Code of Federal Regulations, as
6 in effect on the day before the effective date described in
7 subsection (e).

8 (d) GAO REPORT AFTER MODIFICATION OF AGE-60 9 STANDARD.—Not later than 24 months after the effective 10 date described in subsection (e), the Comptroller General of the United States shall report to the Committee on 11 12 Commerce, Science, and Transportation of the Senate and 13 the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure of the House of Representatives concerning the effect on 14 15 aviation safety, if any, of the modification of the age standard contained in subsection (a). 16

17 (e) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This Act shall take effect on18 the date that is 30 days after the date of the enactment19 of this Act.

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
