To establish a National Commission on the Infrastructure of the United States.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "National Infrastruc-
- 5 ture Improvement Act of 2007".

6 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.

- 7 In this Act:
- 8 (1) ACQUISITION.—The term "acquisition" in9 cludes the addition of land, sites, equipment, struc-

| 3 | (2) COMMISSION.—The term "Commission" |
| 4 | means the National Commission on the Infrastruc- |
| 5 | ture of the United States established by section 3(a). |

| 9 | new infrastructure; |

| 15 | ment infrastructure equipment. |
| 16 | (4) INFRASTRUCTURE.— |
| 17 | (A) IN GENERAL.—The term "infrastruc- |
| 18 | ture" means a nonmilitary structure or facility |
| 19 | and equipment associated with that structure or |
| 20 | facility. |
| 21 | (B) INCLUSIONS.—The term "infrastruc- |
| 22 | ture" includes— |
| 23 | (i) a surface transportation facility |
| 24 | (such as a road, bridge, highway, public |
| 25 | transportation facility, and freight and |

| 21 | (5) MAINTENANCE.—The term "maintenance" |
| 22 | means any regularly scheduled activity, such as a |
| 23 | routine repair, intended to ensure that infrastruc- |
| 24 | ture continues to operate efficiently. |
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| 1 | (6) REHABILITATION.—The term "rehabilita- |
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| 2 | tion" means— |
| 3 | (A) the correction of a deficiency in exist- |
| 4 | ing infrastructure so as to extend the useful life |
| 5 | or improve the effectiveness of the infrastruc- |
| 6 | ture; |
| 7 | (B) the modernization or replacement of |
| 8 | equipment of existing infrastructure; and |
| 9 | (C) the modernization of, or replacement |
| 10 | of parts for, rolling stock relating to infrastruc- |
| 11 | ture. |
| 12 | SEC. 3. ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMISSION. |
| 13 | (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established a com- |
| 14 | mission to be known as the "National Commission on the |
| 15 | Infrastructure of the United States" to ensure that the |
| 16 | infrastructure of the United States— |
| 17 | (1) meets current and future demand; and |
| 18 | (2) facilitates economic growth. |
| 19 | (b) Membership.— |
| 20 | (1) Composition.—The Commission shall be |
| 21 | composed of 8 members, of whom— |
| 22 | (A) 2 members shall be appointed by the |
| 23 | President; |
| 24 | (B) 2 members shall be appointed by the |
| 25 | Speaker of the House of Representatives; |

| 1 | (C) 1 member shall be appointed by the |
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| 2 | minority leader of the House of Representa- |
| 3 | tives; |
| 4 | (D) 2 members shall be appointed by the |
| 5 | majority leader of the Senate; and |
| 6 | (E) 1 member shall be appointed by the |
| 7 | minority leader of the Senate. |
| 8 | (2) QUALIFICATIONS.—Each member of the |
| 9 | Commission shall have experience in 1 or more of |
| 10 | the fields of economics, public administration, civil |
| 11 | engineering, public works, construction, and related |
| 12 | design professions, planning, or public investment fi- |
| 13 | nancing. |
| 14 | (3) DATE OF APPOINTMENTS.—The members |
| 15 | of the Commission shall be appointed under para- |
| 16 | graph (1) not later than 90 days after the enact- |
| 17 | ment of this Act. |
| 18 | (c) TERM; VACANCIES.— |
| 19 | (1) TERM.—A member shall be appointed for |
| 20 | the life of the Commission. |
| 21 | (2) VACANCIES.—A vacancy in the Commis- |
| 22 | sion— |
| 23 | (A) shall not affect the powers of the Com- |
| 24 | mission; and |

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(B) shall be filled, not later than 30 days
 after the date on which the vacancy occurs, in
 the same manner as the original appointment
 was made.

5 (d) INITIAL MEETING.—Not later than 30 days after
6 the date on which all members of the Commission have
7 been appointed, the Commission shall hold the initial
8 meeting of the Commission.

9 (e) MEETINGS.—The Commission shall meet at the
10 call of the Chairperson or the majority of the Commission
11 members.

(f) QUORUM.—A majority of the members of the
Commission shall constitute a quorum, but a lesser number of members may hold hearings.

(g) CHAIRPERSON AND VICE CHAIRPERSON.—The
Commission shall select a Chairperson and Vice Chairperson from among the members of the Commission.

18 **SEC. 4. DUTIES.**

19 (a) Study.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than February 15,
2009, the Commission, in consultation with the advisory group established by paragraph (3)(A), shall
complete a study of all matters relating to the state
of the infrastructure of the United States.

(2) MATTERS TO BE STUDIED.—In carrying out
 paragraph (1), the Commission shall study matters
 such as—

(A) the capacity of infrastructure improvements to sustain current and anticipated economic development and competitiveness, including long-term economic growth, including the potential return to the United States economy on investments in new infrastructure as opposed to investments in existing infrastructure;

(B) the age and condition of public infrastructure (including congestion and changes in the condition of that infrastructure as compared with preceding years);

15 (C) the methods used to finance the con-16 struction, acquisition, rehabilitation, and main-17 tenance of public works improvements (includ-18 ing general obligation bonds, tax-credit bonds, 19 revenue bonds, user fees, excise taxes, direct 20 governmental assistance, and private invest-21 ment), including the effect of different finance 22 structures on the efficiency of infrastructure;

(D) any trends or innovations in methods
used to finance that construction, acquisition,
rehabilitation, and maintenance;

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| 2 | facility, that are necessary to maintain the cur- |
| 3 | rent condition and performance of those facili- |
| 4 | ties and the investment needed (as adjusted for |
| 5 | inflation and expressed in real dollars) to im- |

| 7 | (F)(i) the projected share of Federal, |
| 8 | State, local, and other government levels of in- |
| 9 | vestment requirements as identified in subpara- |
| 10 | graph (E); and |
| 11 | (ii) the projected expenditure on infra- |
| 12 | structure facility improvements described in |
| 13 | subparagraph (E) by each level of government; |
| 14 | (G) estimates of the return to the economy |
| 15 | from public works investment; |
| 16 | (H) any trends or innovations in infra- |
| 17 | structure procurement methods; |
| 18 | (I) any trends or innovations in construc- |
| 19 | tion methods or materials; and |
| 20 | (J) the impact of various land use and eco- |
| 21 | nomic development strategies on infrastructure |
| 22 | needs and investment decisions, including the |
| 23 | effect of metropolitan growth patterns on infra- |
| 24 | structure costs and deferred maintenance. |

(b) RECOMMENDATIONS.—The Commission shall de velop recommendations—

3 (1) on a Federal infrastructure plan that will
4 detail national infrastructure program priorities, in5 cluding alternative methods of meeting national in6 frastructure investment needs to effectuate balanced
7 growth and economic development;

8 (2) on public works improvements and methods
9 of delivering and providing for public work facilities;
10 (3) for analysis or criteria and procedures that
11 may be used by Federal agencies and State and local
12 governments in—

13 (A) inventorying existing and needed pub-14 lic works improvements;

15 (B) assessing the condition of public works16 improvements; and

17 (C) developing uniform criteria and proce18 dures for use in conducting those inventories
19 and assessments; and

20 (4) for proposed guidelines for the uniform re21 porting, by Federal agencies, of construction, acqui22 sition, rehabilitation, and maintenance data with re23 spect to infrastructure improvements.

(c) STATEMENT AND RECOMMENDATIONS.—Not
 later than February 15, 2010, the Commission shall sub mit to Congress—

4 (1) a detailed statement of the findings and 5 conclusions of the Commission; and

6 (2) the recommendations of the Commission
7 under subsection (b), including recommendations for
8 such legislation and administrative actions for 5-,
9 15-, 30-, and 50-year time periods as the Commis10 sion considers to be appropriate.

11 SEC. 5. POWERS OF THE COMMISSION.

(a) HEARINGS.—The Commission shall hold such
hearings, meet and act at such times and places, take such
testimony, administer such oaths, and receive such evidence as the Commission considers advisable to carry out
this Act.

17 (b) INFORMATION FROM FEDERAL AGENCIES.—

18 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Commission may secure
19 directly from a Federal agency such information as
20 the Commission considers necessary to carry out this
21 Act.

(2) PROVISION OF INFORMATION.—On request
of the Chairperson of the Commission, the head of
the Federal agency shall provide the information to
the Commission.

(c) GIFTS.—The Commission may accept, use, and
 dispose of gifts or donations of services or property.

3 (d) CONTRACTS.—The Commission may enter into 4 contracts with other entities, including contracts under 5 which 1 or more entities, with the guidance of the Commission, conduct the study required under section 4(a). 6 7 (e) POSTAL SERVICES.—The Commission may use 8 the United States mails in the same manner and under 9 the same conditions as other agencies of the Federal Gov-10 ernment.

11 SEC. 6. COMMISSION PERSONNEL MATTERS.

(a) COMPENSATION OF MEMBERS.—A member of the
Commission shall serve without pay, but shall be allowed
a per diem allowance for travel expenses, at rates authorized for an employee of an agency under subchapter I of
chapter 57 of title 5, United States Code, while away from
the home or regular place of business of the member in
the performance of the duties of the Commission.

19 (b) Staff.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—The Chairperson of the
Commission may, without regard to the civil service
laws, including regulations, appoint and terminate
an executive director and such other additional personnel as are necessary to enable the Commission to
perform the duties of the Commission.

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| 2 | TOR.—The employment of an executive director shall |
| 3 | be subject to confirmation by a majority of the mem- |
| 4 | bers of the Commission. |
| 5 | (3) Compensation.— |
| 6 | (A) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in |
| 7 | subparagraph (B), the Chairperson of the Com- |
| 8 | mission may fix the compensation of the execu- |
| 9 | tive director and other personnel without regard |
| 10 | to the provisions of chapter 51 and subchapter |
| 11 | III of chapter 53 of title 5, United States Code, |
| 12 | relating to classification of positions and Gen- |
| 13 | eral Schedule pay rates. |
| 14 | (B) MAXIMUM RATE OF PAY.—In no event |
| 15 | shall any employee of the Commission (other |
| 16 | than the executive director) receive as com- |
| 17 | pensation an amount in excess of the maximum |
| 18 | rate of pay for Executive Level IV under sec- |
| 19 | tion 5315 of title 5, United States Code. |
| 20 | (c) Detail of Federal Government Employ- |
| 21 | EES.— |
| 22 | (1) IN GENERAL An appropriate of the Federal |

(1) IN GENERAL.—An employee of the Federal
Government may be detailed to the Commission
without reimbursement.

(2) CIVIL SERVICE STATUS.—The detail of a
 Federal employee shall be without interruption or
 loss of civil service status or privilege.

(d) PROCUREMENT OF TEMPORARY AND INTERMIT-4 5 TENT SERVICES.—On request of the Commission, the Secretary of the Army, acting through the Chief of Engineers, 6 7 shall provide, on a reimbursable basis, such office space, 8 supplies, equipment, and other support services to the 9 Commission and staff of the Commission as are necessary 10 for the Commission to carry out the duties of the Commis-11 sion under this Act.

12 SEC. 7. CONGRESSIONAL BUDGET OFFICE REVIEW.

13 Not later than 90 days after the date on which the report under section 4(c) is submitted to Congress by the 14 15 Commission, the Congressional Budget Office shall review the report and submit a report on the results of the review 16 to the Committee on Environment and Public Works and 17 the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation 18 19 of the Senate and the Committee on Transportation and 20Infrastructure of the House of Representatives.

21 SEC. 8. FUNDING.

For each of fiscal years 2008 through 2010, on request of the Commission—

(1) the Secretary of Transportation shall trans fer to the Commission \$750,000 to carry out this
 Act; and

4 (2) each of the Secretary of the Army, acting
5 through the Chief of Engineers, and the Adminis6 trator of the Environmental Protection Agency shall
7 transfer to the Commission \$375,000 to carry out
8 this Act.

9 SEC. 9. TERMINATION OF COMMISSION.

10 The Commission shall terminate on September 30,11 2010.

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
