A BILL

To amend section 1091 of title 18, United States Code, to allow the prosecution of genocide in appropriate circumstances.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Genocide Account-
5 ability Act of 2007”.

1 **SEC. 2. GENOCIDE.**

2 Section 1091 of title 18, United States Code, is
3 amended by striking subsection (d) and inserting the fol-
4 lowing:

5 “(d) **REQUIRED CIRCUMSTANCE FOR OFFENSES.**—
6 The circumstance referred to in subsections (a) and (c)
7 is that—

8 “(1) the offense is committed in whole or in
9 part within the United States;

10 “(2) the alleged offender is a national of the
11 United States (as that term is defined in section 101
12 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
13 1101));

14 “(3) the alleged offender is an alien lawfully ad-
15 mitted for permanent residence in the United States
16 (as that term is defined in section 101 of the Immi-
17 gration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1101));

18 “(4) the alleged offender is a stateless person
19 whose habitual residence is in the United States; or

20 “(5) after the conduct required for the offense
21 occurs, the alleged offender is brought into, or found
22 in, the United States, even if that conduct occurred
23 outside the United States.”.
