

# S. CON. RES. 107

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## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1       *Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives*  
2 *concurring)*, That it is the sense of Congress that—

3           (1) Members of Congress (or any employee of  
4       a Member of Congress authorized by that Member)  
5       should not be prohibited, with or without prior no-  
6       tice to the Architect of the Capitol, the Chief Execu-  
7       tive Officer for Visitor Services, or the Capitol Guide  
8       Service, from taking guests or visitors into the pub-  
9       licly accessible areas of the United States Capitol  
10      complex during normal business hours;

11          (2) nothing in this resolution shall be construed  
12      to affect the authority granted to employees of Mem-  
13      bers of Congress by the respective Members relating  
14      to the movement of such employees through the  
15      United States Capitol complex;

16          (3) at the direction of the Capitol Police Board  
17      or the fire marshal, the taking of guests or visitors  
18      into the publicly accessible areas of the United  
19      States Capitol complex by a Member of Congress (or

1 any employee of a Member of Congress authorized  
2 by that Member) should be temporarily suspended or  
3 otherwise subject to restriction for safety or security  
4 reasons to the same extent as guided tours of the  
5 United States Capitol complex which are led by the  
6 Architect of the Capitol or the Capitol Guide Service;  
7 and

8 (4) nothing in this resolution shall be interpreted  
9 to contradict the Congressional staff-led tour  
10 policy that ensures that tours of the Capitol are conducted  
11 by staff members who have undergone mandatory  
12 life safety and historical accuracy training.
