Mr. GRAHAM (for himself and Mr. DEMINT) introduced the following joint resolution; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing a balanced budget amendment to the Constitution of the United States.

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled (two-*
3 *thirds of each House concurring therein),* That the fol-
4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
8 States:

1 clared by a joint resolution, adopted by a majority of the
2 whole number of each House, which becomes law.

3 “SECTION 6. The Congress shall enforce and imple-
4 ment this article by appropriate legislation, which may rely
5 on estimates of outlays and receipts.

6 “SECTION 7. Total receipts shall include all receipts
7 of the United States Government except those derived
8 from borrowing. Total outlays shall include all outlays of
9 the United States Government except for those for repay-
10 ment of debt principal.

11 “SECTION 8. The provisions of this article respecting
12 the internal revenue shall take effect upon the date of rati-
13 fication of this article. The remaining provisions of this
14 article shall take effect beginning with the later of the sec-
15 ond fiscal year beginning after its ratification or the first
16 fiscal year beginning after December 31, 2012.”.
