Mr. CHAMBLISS (for himself, Mr. ISAKSON, and Mrs. LINCOLN) submitted the following resolution; which was considered and agreed to

## RESOLUTION

Designating November 25, 2007, as “Drive Safer Sunday”.

Whereas motor vehicle travel is the primary means of transportation in the United States;

Whereas everyone traveling on the roads and highways needs to drive more safely to reduce deaths and injuries resulting from motor vehicle accidents;

Whereas, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, wearing a seat belt saved 15,434 lives in 2004, 15,632 lives in 2005, and 15,383 lives in 2006;

Whereas Secretary of Transportation Mary Peters wants all people of the United States to understand the life-saving importance of wearing a seat belt and encourages motorists to drive safely, not just during the holiday season, but every time they get behind the wheel; and

Whereas the Sunday after Thanksgiving is the busiest highway traffic day of the year: Now, therefore, be it

1       *Resolved*, That the Senate—

2               (1) encourages—

3                       (A) high schools, colleges, universities, ad-  
4                       ministrators, teachers, primary schools, and  
5                       secondary schools to launch campus-wide edu-  
6                       cational campaigns to urge students to be care-  
7                       ful about safety when driving;

8                       (B) national trucking firms to alert their  
9                       drivers to be especially focused on driving safely  
10                      during the heaviest traffic day of the year, and  
11                      to publicize the importance of the day using  
12                      Citizen’s Band (CB) radios and in truck stops  
13                      across the Nation;

14                     (C) clergy to remind their members to  
15                     travel safely when attending services and gath-  
16                     erings;

17                     (D) law enforcement personnel to remind  
18                     drivers and passengers to drive particularly  
19                     safely on the Sunday after Thanksgiving; and

20                     (E) all people of the United States to use  
21                     the Sunday after Thanksgiving as an oppor-  
22                     tunity to educate themselves about highway  
23                     safety; and

1           (2) designates November 25, 2007, as “Drive  
2    Safer Sunday”.
