- 8 SEC. 2. RESPONSIBILITY OF CAPITOL POLICE BOARD.
- 9 The Capitol Police Board shall take such actions as
- 10 may be necessary to carry out the event.
- 11 SEC. 3. CONDITIONS RELATING TO PHYSICAL PREPARA-
- 12 TIONS.
- 13 The Architect of the Capitol may prescribe conditions
- 14 for physical preparations for the event.
- 15 SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.
- 16 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-
- 17 ment of the restrictions contained in section 5104(c) of
- 18 title 40, United States Code, concerning sales, advertise-
- 19 ments, displays, and solicitations on the Capitol Grounds,

- 1 as well as other restrictions applicable to the Capitol
- 2 Grounds, in connection with the event.
