JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States relating to equality of rights and reproductive rights.

1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives

2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled

3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-

4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
8 States:

"ARTICLE —

2 "SECTION 1. Equality of rights under the law shall
3 not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any
4 State on account of sex.

5 "SECTION 2. Reproductive rights for women under
6 the law shall not be denied or abridged by the United
7 States or any State.

8 "SECTION 3. Congress shall have power to enforce9 and implement this article by appropriate legislation.

10 "SECTION 4. This amendment shall take effect two11 years after the date of ratification.".
