**AN ACT**

To amend the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act to designate a segment of Illabot Creek in Skagit County, Washington, as a component of the National Wild and Scenic Rivers System.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. DESIGNATION OF WILD AND SCENIC RIVER**  
4 **SEGMENTS.**

5 Section 3(a) of the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act (16  
6 U.S.C. 1274(a)) is amended by adding at the end the fol-  
7 lowing:

1 “(\_\_\_\_) ILLABOT CREEK, WASHINGTON.—

2 “(A) The 14.3 mile segment from the  
3 headwaters of Illabot Creek to the northern ter-  
4 minus as generally depicted on the map titled  
5 ‘Illabot Creek Proposed WSR – Northern Ter-  
6 minus’, dated September 15, 2009, to be ad-  
7 ministered by the Secretary of Agriculture as  
8 follows:

9 “(i) The 4.3 mile segment from the  
10 headwaters of Illabot Creek to the bound-  
11 ary of Glacier Peak Wilderness Area as a  
12 wild river.

13 “(ii) The 10 mile segment from the  
14 boundary of Glacier Peak Wilderness to  
15 the northern terminus as generally de-  
16 picted on the map titled ‘Illabot Creek  
17 Proposed WSR – Northern Terminus’,  
18 dated September 15, 2009, as a rec-  
19 reational river.

20 “(B) Action required to be taken under  
21 subsection (d)(1) for the river segments des-  
22 ignated under this paragraph shall be com-  
23 pleted through revision of the Skagit Wild and  
24 Scenic River comprehensive management  
25 plan.”.
