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## A BILL

To amend the National Children’s Island Act of 1995 to expand allowable uses for Kingman and Heritage Islands by the District of Columbia, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Kingman and Heritage  
5 Islands Act of 2009”.

6 **SEC. 2. AMENDMENTS TO NATIONAL CHILDREN’S ISLAND**

7 **ACT OF 1995.**

8 (a) **EXPANSION OF ALLOWABLE USES FOR KINGMAN**  
9 **AND HERITAGE ISLANDS.**—The National Children’s Is-

1 land Act of 1995 (sec. 10–1401 et seq., D.C. Official  
2 Code) is amended by adding at the end the following:

3 **“SEC. 7. COMPREHENSIVE AND ANACOSTIA WATERFRONT**  
4 **FRAMEWORK PLANS.**

5 “(a) COMPLIANCE WITH PLANS.—Notwithstanding  
6 any other provision of this Act, it is not a violation of  
7 the terms and conditions of this Act for the District of  
8 Columbia to use the lands conveyed and the easements  
9 granted under this Act in accordance with the Anacostia  
10 Waterfront Framework Plan and the Comprehensive Plan.

11 “(b) DEFINITIONS.—For purposes of this section, the  
12 following definitions apply:

13 “(1) ANACOSTIA WATERFRONT FRAMEWORK  
14 PLAN.—The term ‘Anacostia Waterfront Framework  
15 Plan’ means the November 2003 Anacostia Water-  
16 front Framework Plan to redevelop and revitalize  
17 the Anacostia waterfront in the District of Colum-  
18 bia, as may be amended from time to time, devel-  
19 oped pursuant to a memorandum of understanding  
20 dated March 22, 2000, between the General Services  
21 Administration, Government of the District of Co-  
22 lumbia, Office of Management and Budget, Naval  
23 District Washington, Military District Washington,  
24 Marine Barracks Washington, Department of Labor,  
25 Department of Transportation, National Park Serv-

1 ice, Army Corps of Engineers, Environmental Pro-  
2 tection Agency, Washington Metropolitan Area  
3 Transit Authority, National Capital Planning Com-  
4 mission, National Arboretum, and Small Business  
5 Administration.

6 “(2) COMPREHENSIVE PLAN.—The term ‘Com-  
7 prehensive Plan’ means the Comprehensive Plan of  
8 the District of Columbia approved by the Council of  
9 the District of Columbia on December 28, 2006, as  
10 such plan may be amended or superseded from time  
11 to time.”.

12 (b) RELEASE OF REVERSIONARY INTEREST.—Sec-  
13 tion 3 of such Act (sec. 10–1402, D.C. Official Code) is  
14 amended by striking subsection (d).

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
