A BILL

To direct the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency to convene a task force to develop recommendations on the proper disposal of unused pharmaceuticals, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Drug Free Water Act
- 5 of 2009".

1	SEC. 2. TASK FORCE ON PROPER DISPOSAL OF UNUSED
2	PHARMACEUTICALS.
3	(a) In General.—In furtherance of the national
4	goals and policies set forth in section 101 of the Federal
5	Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C. 1251), the Ad-
6	ministrator of the Environmental Protection Agency (in
7	this Act referred to as the "Administrator") shall convene
8	a task force (in this Act referred to as the "task force")
9	to develop—
10	(1) recommendations on the proper disposal of
11	unused pharmaceuticals by consumers, health care
12	providers, and others, which recommendations
13	shall—
14	(A) be calculated to prevent or reduce the
15	detrimental effects on the environment and
16	human health caused by introducing unused
17	pharmaceuticals, directly or indirectly, into
18	water systems; and
19	(B) provide for limiting the disposal of un-
20	used pharmaceuticals through treatment works
21	in accordance with the Federal Water Pollution
22	Control Act (33 U.S.C. 1251 et seq.); and
23	(2) a strategy for the Federal Government to
24	educate the public on such recommendations.
25	(b) Membership.—The task force shall be composed
26	0f—

1	(1) the Administrator (or the Administrator's
2	designee), who shall serve as the Chair of the task
3	force;
4	(2) the Commissioner of Food and Drugs (or

- 4 (2) the Commissioner of Food and Drugs (or 5 the Commissioner's designee); and
- 6 (3) such other members as the Administrator 7 may appoint.
- 8 (c) Report.—Not later than 1 year after the date 9 of the enactment of this Act, the task force shall submit 10 a report to the Congress containing the recommendations 11 and strategy required by subsection (a).
- 12 (d) STAFF OF FEDERAL AGENCIES.—Upon request
 13 of the task force, the head of any department or agency
 14 of the United States may detail any of the personnel of
 15 that department or agency to the task force to assist in
 16 carrying out its duties under this section.
- 17 (e) TERMINATION.—The task force shall terminate 18 180 days after submitting the report required by sub-19 section (c).
