3	SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.
4	Section 306 of the Hydrographic Services Improve-
5	ment Act of 1998 (33 U.S.C. 892d) is amended—
6	(1) by inserting before the text the following: "(a)
7	In General.—"; and
8	(2) by adding at the end the following new sub-
9	section:
10	"(b) Arctic Programs.—Of the amount authorized
11	for each of fiscal years 2011 and 2012—
12	"(1) \$5,000,000 is authorized for use to acquire
13	hydrographic data, provide hydrographic services,
14	conduct coastal change analyses necessary to ensure
15	safe navigation, and improve the management of
16	coastal change in the Arctic; and
17	"(2) \$2,000,000 is authorized for use to acquire
18	hydrographic data and provide hydrographic services
19	in the Arctic necessary to delineate the United States
20	extended Continental Shelf.".
