A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of Defense to pay an additional amount of assignment special pay to members of the Armed Forces who agree to serve in Afghanistan for up to six years or the duration of the United States mission in that country.

5	(a) Additional Assignment Pay Authorized.—
6	Notwithstanding the limitations specified in subsection (b)
7	of section 352 of title 37, United States Code, on the max-
8	imum amount of assignment or special duty pay that may
9	be paid to a member of the Armed Forces under such sec-
10	tion, the Secretary of Defense may authorize the payment
11	of assignment pay in the total amount of \$250,000 to a
12	member who agrees to serve on active duty in Afghanistan
13	for six years or the duration of the United States mission
14	in Afghanistan, whichever occurs first. The assignment pe-
15	riod required by the agreement shall provide for reason-
16	able periods of leave.
17	(b) Increased Amounts for Members Fluent in
18	CERTAIN LANGUAGES.—If a member described in sub-
19	section (a) scores a 4.0 on the Foreign Service Institute
20	test for the dominant languages of Pashto and Dari, the
