Mr. HINOJOSA (for himself, Mr. FRANK of Massachusetts, and Ms. WATERS) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Financial Services

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## A BILL

To authorize appropriations for the rural housing and economic development program of the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Rural Housing and  
5 Economic Development Improvement Act of 2009”.

6 **SEC. 2. RURAL HOUSING AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**  
7 **ASSISTANCE.**

8 (a) USE.—The Secretary of Housing and Urban De-  
9 velopment may carry out a program, through the Office

1 of Rural Housing and Economic Development, to provide  
2 assistance to Indian tribes, State housing finance agen-  
3 cies, State community or economic development agencies,  
4 local nonprofit organizations, and community development  
5 corporations in rural areas to support innovative housing  
6 and economic development activities in rural areas.

7 (b) REQUIREMENT OF SOCIAL SECURITY ACCOUNT  
8 NUMBER FOR ASSISTANCE.—As a condition of initial or  
9 continuing assistance under any housing or economic de-  
10 velopment activity that is provided assistance with  
11 amounts made available under this section, the Secretary  
12 of Housing and Urban Development shall require that  
13 each member of a family so assisted (or of a family apply-  
14 ing for such assistance) who is 18 years of age or older  
15 or is the spouse of the head of household of such family,  
16 shall have a valid social security number.

17 (c) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is  
18 authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary of Housing  
19 and Urban Development for assistance under this sec-  
20 tion—

- 21 (1) \$30,000,000 for fiscal year 2010; and  
22 (2) \$40,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2011,  
23 2012, 2013, 2014, and 2015.

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
