## A BILL

To require the Secretary of Homeland Security, in consultation with the Secretary of State, to submit a report on the effects of the Merida Initiative on the border security of the United States, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. REPORT ON MERIDA INITIATIVE.
- 4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 18 months after
- 5 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of
- 6 Homeland Security, in consultation with the Secretary of

- 1 State, shall submit to Congress a report on the effects of
- 2 the Merida Initiative on the following:
- 3 (1) Enhancing border security.
- 4 (2) Reducing the potential for border violence.
- 5 (3) Preventing the illicit flow of arms and bulk
- 6 cash across the border between the United States
- 7 and Mexico.
- 8 (b) Merida Initiative Defined.—In this section,
- 9 the term "Merida Initiative" means the program an-
- 10 nounced by the United States and Mexico on October 22,
- 11 2007, to fight illicit narcotics trafficking and criminal or-
- 12 ganizations throughout the Western Hemisphere.
