- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 That section 2680(k) of title 28, United States Code, is
- 4 amended by striking the period at the end and inserting
- 5 ", except a claim made by an individual who is in that

- 1 foreign country to accompany, with the knowledge and
- 2 consent of the Government, an employee of the Govern-
- 3 ment who is in that foreign country on behalf of the
- 4 United States. For the purpose of the exception in the
- 5 preceding sentence, the law of the place where the act or
- 6 omission occurred shall be deemed to be the law of the
- 7 current or last United States domicile of the claimant."
