A BILL

To provide for a study relating to the feasibility of using postal employees as census enumerators.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. FINDINGS.
4	Congress finds that—
5	(1) the Bureau of the Census needs an accurate
6	count, based on all households in the United States.
7	to conduct a decennial census;
8	(2) the Bureau of the Census spends years and
9	billions of taxpayer dollars to find and then verify
10	where all such households are located;

1	(3) the Bureau of the Census relies on part-
2	time enumerators to assist in the constitutionally
3	mandated decennial census; and

(4) the United States Postal Service has more experience than any other organization in finding and delivering services to all households in the United States, and is thus uniquely positioned to assist the Bureau of the Census to achieve a complete and accurate enumeration of the population.
