A BILL

To extend to individuals evacuated from their residences as a result of a major disaster the right to use the absentee balloting and registration procedures available to military and overseas voters under the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act, to direct the Election Assistance Commission to make grants to States to respond to election administration needs which result from a major disaster, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "Disaster Assistance
- 3 Voting Act of 2009".
- 4 SEC. 2. APPLICABILITY OF PROTECTIONS FOR ABSENT
- 5 MILITARY AND OVERSEAS VOTERS TO INDI-
- 6 VIDUALS EVACUATED AS A RESULT OF
- 7 MAJOR DISASTER.
- 8 (a) Right of Evacuees To Use Absentee Bal-
- 9 LOTING AND REGISTRATION PROCEDURES AVAILABLE TO
- 10 MILITARY AND OVERSEAS VOTERS.—In the case of any
- 11 individual who is an eligible evacuee—
- 12 (1) the individual shall be treated in the same
- manner as an absent uniformed services voter and
- overseas voter for purposes of the Uniformed and
- Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (42 U.S.C.
- 16 1973ff et seq.), other than section 103(b)(1) (42)
- 17 U.S.C. 1973ff-2(b)(1); and
- 18 (2) the individual shall be deemed to be an indi-
- vidual who is entitled to vote by absentee ballot for
- 20 purposes of the National Voter Registration Act of
- 21 1993 and the Help America Vote Act of 2002.
- (b) Definitions.—For purposes of this section, the
- 23 following definitions apply:
- 24 (1) The term "eligible evacuee" means an indi-
- 25 vidual—

1	(A) who certifies to the appropriate State
2	election official that the individual's predisaster
3	primary residence is rendered uninhabitable or
4	inaccessible as a result of damage or evacuation
5	caused by a major disaster; and
6	(B) who provides the official with an affi-
7	davit stating that the individual intends to re-
8	turn to the place of residence where the indi-
9	vidual is otherwise qualified to vote after the
10	election or elections involved.
11	(2) The term "major disaster" has the meaning
12	given such term under section 102 of the Robert T.
13	Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance
14	Act (42 U.S.C. 5122).
15	(3) The term "State" means each of the several
16	States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth
17	of Puerto Rico, American Samoa, Guam, and the
18	United States Virgin Islands.
19	(c) Effective Date.—This section shall apply with

20 respect to elections for Federal office held in calendar

21 years beginning with 2010.

1	SEC. 3. GRANTS TO STATES FOR RESPONDING TO ELEC-
2	TION ADMINISTRATION NEEDS RESULTING
3	FROM MAJOR NATURAL DISASTERS.
4	(a) Authority To Make Grants.—The Election
5	Assistance Commission shall make a grant to each eligible
6	State, in such amount as the Commission considers appro-
7	priate, for purposes of restoring and replacing supplies,
8	materials, and equipment used in the administration of
9	elections in the State which were damaged as a result of
10	a major natural disaster, and for conducting voter out-
11	reach and education for voters displaced as a result of a
12	major natural disaster, as determined on the basis of such
13	criteria as the Commission may establish.
14	(b) Eligibility.—
15	(1) In general.—A State is eligible to receive
16	a grant under this section if it submits to the Com-
17	mission (at such time and in such form as the Com-
18	mission may require) a certification that supplies,
19	materials, and equipment used in the administration
20	of elections in the State were damaged as a result
21	of a major natural disaster.
22	(2) Preference for states using funds
23	FOR SATELLITE VOTING SITES.—In determining the
24	eligibility of States for receiving grants under this
25	section and the amount of the grant awarded to a

State, the Commission shall give preference to

- 1 States which will use the grant to operate voting
- 2 sites for displaced voters which are located outside
- of the area which was affected by the major natural
- 4 disaster.
- 5 (c) Definition.—In this section, the term "State"
- 6 means each of the several States, the District of Columbia,

- 23 (1) In General.—Section 408(b) of the Robert
- 24 T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assist-

ance Act (42 U.S.C. 5174(b)) is amended by adding at the end the following new paragraph:

"(3) Notification of availability of right to use certain absentee balloting and receives individual and household who receives housing assistance under this section of the protections provided by section 2 of the Disaster Assistance Voting Act of 2009 (relating to the right to register to vote and vote by absentee ballot in elections for Federal office) and of the requirements for obtaining those protections, including the requirement to submit an affidavit stating that the individual intends to return to the place of residence where the individual is otherwise qualified to vote.".

(2) Effective date.—The amendment made by paragraph (1) shall apply with respect to assistance received on or after the date of the enactment of this Act.
