SECTION 1. WAIVER OF 35-MILE RULE TO PERMIT RECOGNITION OF TYLER MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

AS A CRITICAL ACCESS HOSPITAL UNDER
THE MEDICARE PROGRAM.

1820(c)(2)(B)(i)(I) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.

1395i-4(c)(2)(B)(i)(I)) for purposes of obtaining designa-

- 2 gram effective for cost reporting periods beginning on or

3 after July 1, 2009.

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
