Resolved, That the bill from the House of Representatives (H.R. 3978) entitled "An Act to amend the Implementing Recommendations of the 9/11 Commission Act of 2007 to authorize the Secretary of Homeland Security to accept and use gifts for otherwise authorized activities of the Center for Domestic Preparedness that are related to preparedness for and response to terrorism, and for other purposes.", do pass with the following

AMENDMENTS:

Strike out all after the enacting clause and insert:

10	ing "and by section 93" and all that follows through
11	"or donations" and inserting "by section 93 of title
12	14, United States Code, or by section 525 or 884 of
13	this Act, gifts or donations"; and
14	(3) in section 884 (6 U.S.C. 464), by adding at
15	the end the following:
16	"(c) Acceptance and Use of Gifts.—The Federal
17	Law Enforcement Training Center may accept and use
18	gifts of property, both real and personal, and accept serv-
19	ices, for authorized purposes.".
20	(b) Technical and Conforming Amendments.—
21	(1) The homeland security act of 2002.—
22	The Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 101 et
23	seq.) is amended in the table of contents by inserting
24	after the item relating to section 524 the following:
	"Sec. 525. Acceptance of gifts.".

(2) Repeal.—The matter under the heading 1 2 "SALARIES AND EXPENSES" under the heading "FED-3 ERAL LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING CENTER" under 4 title IV of the Department of Homeland Security Appropriations Act, 2004 (6 U.S.C. 464a) is amended 5 6 by striking "Provided, That in fiscal year 2004 and 7 thereafter, the Center is authorized to accept and use 8 gifts of property, both real and personal, and to ac-9 cept services, for authorized purposes: Provided fur-10 ther," and inserting "Provided,".

Amend the title so as to read: "An Act to amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to authorize the Secretary of Homeland Security to accept and use gifts for otherwise authorized activities of the Center for Domestic Preparedness that are related to preparedness for a response to terrorism, and for other purposes.".
